*** THE LAST TO LEAVE.**
An Episode of Libby Prison Recalled in this City.

A statement has been published that Col. James Stewart, of Pittsburg, was the last Union officer to leave Libby Prison. That this is not true, the following letter will prove. The men who signed it were the last men that were held in that prison. This is of local interest to Findlay people because first among the names are Captains James Wilson and A. S. Skilton, of the 57th Regiment:

C. S. MILITARY PRISON,
 RICHMOND, VA., April 3, 1865.
 Brig. Gen. John E. Mulford, Commis
 sioner of Exchange.

SIR--We would respectfully ask an intercession in our behalf as old prisoners of war who have been in the hands of the Confederate authorities from six to twenty-three months. All of us, at the time of the agreement for exchange, had made our escape from prison (in many cases the third and fourth time) and in attempting to reach our lines were recaptured. During the interval of escape and apprehension, all of our fellow-officers were paroled and sent North, and, as far as we can positively ascertain, we are the only old prisoners now in the hands of the Confederate authorities.

We deem it nothing more than justice to ourselves that our case have a favorable consideration, and at the earliest practicable moment as consistent with the interests of the United States Government. Very respectfully,
