Know ye, That William Bensingier of Captain of Company (C), 13th Regiment of U. S. Colored Infantry VOLUNTEERS who was enrolled on the Twenty first day of September one thousand eight hundred and Sixty three to serve Three years or during the war, is hereby **Discharged** from the service of the United States, this Tenth day of January, 1866, at Nashville Tennessee by reason of S. O. No. 167 dated December 21, 1865. Noil. Div. Tenn. (No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)

Said William Bensingier was born in Congress Township in the State of Ohio, is Twenty three years of age. Five feet Eight inches high. Fair complexion, Blue eyes, Dark hair, and by occupation, when enrolled, a Private of Co. G 21st U. S. Colored Infantry at Nashville Tenn this Tenth day of January, 1866.

This sentence will be erased there to anything in the conduct or physical condition of the soldier rendering him unfit for the Army
