

them than he can the food they ate.





I have known said Claimant, since 1857 and have been so situated that I can know him very well to this time. I know him to be an able bodied man until 1882 when he had in the year of 1882 to 1883. He had worked for me a great deal previous to that time. He then worked for me again during the summer season from 1887 to about 1888. He worked until he was unable to work any longer by reason of being afflicted with Diarrhoea. I am known him since he quit laboring for me and know that he has been unable to do any labor for me or any one else for the last 8 or 10 years and the last two or three years has been totally unable to labor at any time. He is a man of good habits, sober and industrious and the same was not broken by vicious habits. I belonged to O. S. G. O. U. S.

The above statements were made and written in my presence and only for my oral declaration which I have made this 12th day of January 1897, at Newberg, O., by George F. Bender and in making said statements, I did so from my own personal knowledge and was not aided or prompted by any written or dictated by any other person and attached as an exhibit to my testimony. 
