

To Henry Copus, North Baltimore, Ohio

Father,

I don't hardly know what to write for there is no news in camp now hardly atal. There is a good many of our regiment reinlisting a gain. There is about two thirs of the regt's inlisted now and they are some every day. They get four hundred and two dollars bounty. You know thats looks perty big in a solders eye.

I want you to write and let me know what you think of it. Well that is a nuf about the Solders for this time.

We have been short on food but is better now , we get enoug now to do pery well. You wanted to know how many men was in the 21st. I don't know just how many soldiers there is but about 300 men now.

Father Lieutenant Porter made out a list of Georges pay that was coming to him and sent it to you, if you don't under stand it you can go to Findlay and get some man to tend to it for you. Thay say you can get the bounty and all if you tend to it.

**This letter is inconplet it was written by the son of Henry Copus by his son John after the battle of Chichamauga. John's brothers Joseph and Henry Jr. were captured in the battle of Chichamauga. Henry died In Rebal prision at Danville Va.**
