1 Be it remembered, That on Wednesday, December 24th, 1890,
2 the same being the 3rd juridical day of the December Term,
3 1890, of the Porter Circuit Court, held at the Court House
4 in the city of Valparaiso, Indiana, before the Honorable
5 WILLIAM JOHNSTON, the then regular Judge of said Court, the
6 following proceedings were by said Court had and entered of
7 record in the following cause, to-wit:-
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9 Eliza Hornbee :
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12 Comes now the plaintiff, by counsel, and
13 shows to the Court by the Sheriff's return to the writ of
14 summons heretofore issued in this behalf, that the defend-
15 ant had been duly served with process herein, ten days
16 before the first day of the present term of this Court,
17 which writ and return are in these words (insert).

18 And thereupon the said defendant Thomas Hornbee is
19 three times called in open Court, comes not, but herein
20 wholly makes default.

23 Be it further remembered, That on Saturday, April 11th,
24 1891, the same being the 30th juridical day of the March
25 Term, 1891, of the Porter Circuit Court, held at the place
26 and before the Honorable Judge aforesaid, the following
27 further proceedings were by said Court had and entered of
28 record, in the following cause, to-wit:-

5 Now again comes the plaintiff, in per-
6 son and by counsel, and this cause is now submitted to the
7 Court for trial, and the Court after hearing the evidence
8 and being sufficiently advised in the premises, finds for
9 the plaintiff, that all the material allegations of her
10 complaint are true and that she should be divorced from the
11 defendant Thomas Hornbee.


12 And the Court further finds that the plaintiff is en-
13 titled to recover of the defendant as ALIMONY the sum of
14 Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

15 It is therefore considered and adjudged by the Court
16 that the plaintiff ELIZA HORNBEE be and she is hereby
17 divorced from the defendant THOMAS HORNBEE and that the
18 covenants of marriage heretofore existing between them be
19 and the same are hereby dissolved.

20 And it is further ordered and decreed by the Court
21 that the plaintiff recover of the defendant as ALIMONY the
22 sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) together with her
23 costs and charges in this behalf expended, taxed at \$24.00.

24 Upon which judgment appears the
25 following Attorney's lien.


