It is with considerable pleasure that I embrace this blessed opportunity to drop a few lines to inform you that my health is good at present hoping that this may meet you enjoying the same blessing we arrived at our old camp on Saturday last and found the boys all well they had commenced to <sup>work</sup> at the Blockhouses again we have a great deal of <sup>work</sup> to do yet before they are complete we have 30 prisoners now we put them to work while they are here I am sorry to tell you that our Colonel is going to leave us he is to be promoted to a Brigadier general he has taken command of A

Brigade. last week in the southern  
part of this state he said if he  
is appointed he will take his old  
Regiment with him so I suppose  
these will be some prospect  
for leaving here if he gets to be  
a general and have had a great  
deal of rain since I am in story  
if it rained as much in December  
as it did here I think it is not  
enough if received a letter from  
John today he says he belongs  
to a battery but just as long as  
the battles of Richburg last then  
he is will go into his Reg again  
The way John writes to me I  
think he is all right yet I  
dont think there is much seek  
about him we was mustered into the  
service today again we are mustered  
into the service every two months  
I am a great deal better contented

Since I was at home than I was  
before but how long it will  
remain so I cannot tell but  
I dont think I will ever be fully  
satisfied untill I can go home  
to remain there I have not much  
to write this time it is but a  
short time since we covered  
to gether dont forget to write  
as soon as you can and give me  
all the particulars of home  
no more at present But I remain
