



The original 18-hole course was designed by world renowned golf architect Perry Maxwell in 1946, and named Azalea and Dogwood to reflect the beautiful floral surroundings.

In 1966, an additional 9-holes were added to the Lakewood Golf Club which were designed and built by Joe Lee. This addition was named the Magnolia course.

In 1986 another 9-holes were added, bringing the total to 35-holes of championship golf. The newest nine, designed by Ron Garl, showcases distinctive architectural features such as natural sand waste areas, Scottish designed bunkers and a spectacular island green. The 321-yard par-five 14th features a 10,000 square foot island green surrounded by a natural spring fed four-acre lake.

These final 9-holes were inserted between holes five and six of the Azalea course, while the Magnolia course was absorbed as the first 9-holes of the Dogwood course.
