ONE
MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

The application of these rules will be under the jurisdiction of a Membership Committee, said committee to be appointed by the Directors of Lakewood Golf Club.

TWO
CLASSES OF MEMBERSHIP

There shall be four types of membership in Lakewood Golf Club, made up of the following classes, viz.:

- A. Full Membership
 - (1) Individual
 - (a) Resident
 - (b) Non-Resident
 - (2) Junior Individual
- B. Business Membership
- C. House Membership
- D. Swimming Membership

THREE
DEFINITIONS OF MEMBERSHIP
AND PRIVILEGES

A. The term "all privileges of the club" wherever herein used, is hereby defined to mean the use of the golf course, club house and the swimming pool at Grand Hotel.

B. A Resident Member is one who has his or her main place of domicile in Mobile County or Baldwin County, Alabama.

A Non-Resident Member is one whose main place of domicile is other than in Mobile County or Baldwin County, Alabama.

The determination of whether a member is a resident or non-resident shall be vested exclusively in the Membership Committee.

C. Full Membership shall include the following privileges:

- (i) The member, his wife, unmarried sons under the age of 25 years and unmarried daughters shall be entitled to all privileges of the club; and
- (ii) The right to designate sons and sons-in-law who may apply for membership without payment of any initiation fee.

D. Business Membership shall entitle the business concern to name up to 6 of its full time employees as members (officers being considered as employees) and such employees, their wives and unmarried sons under the age of 25 years and unmarried daughters shall be entitled to all privileges of the club.

E. House Membership shall include the following privileges:

- (i) The member, his wife, unmarried sons under the age of 25 years and unmarried daughters shall be entitled to all privileges of the club except use of the golf course; and
- (ii) The right to designate sons and sons-in-law who may apply for House Membership without payment of any initiation fee, unless the son or son-in-law so designated wishes to apply for a Full Membership, in which event he shall pay the initiation fee for a Full Membership, less the initiation fee in effect at that time for a House Membership.
