

A few words about quack grass and similar grasses. In a heavy infested patch cultivation measures are still required.

Neighbors feud over road

As unwilling arbitrators of a neighborhood feud, Island County Commissioners called 'time' Monday and postponed to June 1 further hearing on vacation of a 'road' on Camano Island.

Property owners of Lots 2 to 10 in Madrona Heights appeared at the hearing this week to protest or uphold vacation of the 'road,' a 10-foot wide strip running along the beach side of their lots.

The feud began last March
