

THE GROUNDS: All the facilities of the MAGIC AGE OF STEAM are located on the grounds of a late-Victorian country mansion built by Israel W. Marshall in 1897. The huge house is not open to the public and is still occupied by his daughter-in-law and grandson. But you can browse around the lawn surrounding the home, take advantage of the limited picnicking facilities under the giant trees, visit the snack bar, and observe the many steam exhibits including a steam roller, a traction engine, and a steam popcorn machine. It is on and around these grounds that the various rides take place.





THE RIDES: The most popular ride continues to be the tiny coal-burning AUBURN VALLEY R.R., built to the scale of 11/2" to the foot, each train being pulled by an authentic steam locomotive. There are six locomotives that will run on this tiny Line, with track gauge only 7½" in width, yet up to 30 passengers can be carried on a single train. There is a double-tracked tunnel, two trestles, many switches, and a ride totaling almost ¾ mile. In addition, an original 1915 STANLEY STEAMER "Mountain Wagon" carries delighted passengers around the grounds. There is a paddle-wheel steamboat, a ferry boat, a Toonerville Trolley, and a miniature Ferris Wheel, all of which are favorites with people of all ages.

THE MUSEUM: Housed in the T. Clarence Marshall Museum, built in 1947, is the largest collection of steam-powered automobiles in the world. 15 Stanleys, one of each distinct model, a Toledo, a Doble, and a White make up the steam car roster. Most of these cars are in running condition. There is also a mammoth Pierce-Arrow, a famous Model T Ford, a Rauch & Lang Electric Car, and two beautiful classic Packard Twelves. In addition to the cars, models of stationary steam engines, many of them running on steam, are on display. Locomotives of three scales are in the Museum, plus a number of other relics of the age of steam in America.
