

Biography HBA - Crowell

My earliest recollections date back to about 1936 or '37 when on a hot summer day my father came home to take my mother, Edwin and me for a ride to get some "air" and to cool off. At The time Edwin was an infant. The drive was to Crowell on rte 82 in Yorklyn. My father called on Bill Baldwin while The 3 of us waited in The car. At That time Crowell made cloth box tape, and Adelman Bag & Burlap Co brought Their waste. The cloth trim waste was stored at AB&B until They had enough to fill a rail car and ship it to a paper mill, I Think in Ohio. The large waste was where There ~~was~~ was a cloth leader, ~~or~~ trailer or delamination from The paper. This product was separated at AB&B from The paper and The cloth was sold as cloth waste for wipers etc. Crowell was an account my father opened up in about 1928.
