Tuesday, September 27

- Arrival at Williamsburg Lodge from Richmond during afternoon. Car parked in Craft House parking lot adjacent in lighted, roped-off area.
- 5 p.m. - Informal welcome by representatives of City of Williamsburg, Williamsburg Junior Chamber of Commerce and Colonial Williamsburg.
- 6:30 p.m. Group dinner. Game room of Williamsburg Lodge. Special menu.
- 8:15 p.m. Program at Reception Center on archaeology work in Williamsburg, presented with color slides by Minor Wine Thomas, Jr., of the Colonial Williamsburg staff.
- 9 p.m. - Special showing for Glidden Tourists of color film "Historic Virginia" produced by the Esso Standard Oil Company.

Wednesday, September 28

- 9:30 a.m. Escorted group tour of restored area begins at Reception Center.
- 3:30 p.m. Parade. Tourists will form and pick up police and ranger escort at Craft House parking area. Proceed east on Francis Street to Capitol, west along Duke of Gloucester Street to College, south on Boundary to Francis Street and east to Parkway tunnel and thence to Yorktown. Sightseeing under National Park Service guide. Return to Williamsburg via Parkway.

- 7:00 A.M. Start of Tour at Gettysburg, Penna. Each car checks out
to at Headquarters, Hotel Gettysburg.
- 11:00 A.M. Final check-out time for start of Tour.
- ? Front Royal, Virginia. Each car stops at designated control point
for time check and road instructions.
- ? Luray, Virginia. Each car checks in at Headquarters, Mimslyn Hotel,
immediately upon arrival in Luray for time check in, assignment to
garage, etc.
- 3:00 P.M. Carillon Recital, Luray Singing Tower. Those who are fortunate
to enough to arrive by this time are urged to drive 0.3 miles from the
3:45 Hotel to the Singing Tower Park (can be seen from the Hotel) to
hear the wonderful open-air Carillon Recital. No charge.
- 5:00 P.M. Garaging of cars, according to assignment, only during this time in
to private establishments kindly arranged for us in the absence of
7:00 P.M. public garage facilities. A charge of 75¢ per car will be collected
and donated to a local charity.
- 6:30 P.M. Tour Group Dinner at Mimslyn Hotel; \$2.00 each. Please be in dining
room promptly at 6:30 P.M. for this is a group dinner where items of
importance to all Tour members will be discussed briefly.
- 8:45 P.M. Trip through Luray Caverns. Entire group is urged to leave the
dining room prepared to board busses especially provided to take
us directly to Luray caverns, which are being held open at this
late hour expressly for our convenience. Entire trip will take
about 30 minutes; price to Glidden Tour Group will be \$1.00 plus
20¢ tax. For our further convenience, the bus fare of 15¢ will be
collected at time of purchase of Cavern admission - total cost of
\$1.35. There is no regular bus service in Luray so the special
bus fare will include a return trip to the Hotel and then to any
other part of town we may be quartered. Those who may not wish to
visit the Caverns but who may want to be transferred from Mimslyn
Hotel to some other place in Luray or vicinity where they will spend
the night may also avail themselves of this bus service for 15¢.

1. **What make is it?**
Stanley Steam Car.
2. **How fast will it go?**
60 miles per hour.
3. **What year is it?**
1914.
4. **What makes it go?**
500 lbs. per square inch steam pressure.
5. **What type of power plant?**
Same as a locomotive.
6. **What fuel does it burn?**
Kerosene oil.
7. **How much?**
10 to 15 miles per gallon.
8. **How much water does it hold?**
40 gallons.
9. **How far can you go on a tank of water?**
40 to 50 miles.
10. **What horsepower?**
10 h. p.
11. **Where is the boiler?**
Under the hood.
12. **Where is the engine?**
On the rear axle.
13. **How many cylinders?**
Two.
14. **How long does it take to get up steam?**
From cold, about 15 minutes. Once up, the pilot light will hold the pressure indefinitely.
15. **Where can you get tires?**
