BARN DESTROYED BY FIRE; LOSS IS \$10,000

of undetermined origin destroyed a large barn, together with livestock and machinery on farm of Frank Helm, Gardnersville, noon today, causing damage estimated at \$10,000.

In addition to the year's crops in the barn, three heifers, a number of chickens, several a hay loader, tractor and two horses were destroyed.

The fire, which was discovered at 11 a. m., is believed to have started at an unknown time before. Mr. Helm and his son were in a field husking corn when the son was sent to the barn to feed the horses. He discovered the fire and rushed to the home of a neighbor, Elmer Hikes, from where the Gardnersville, Biglerville and Pottsville fire company trucks were summoned.

The barn burned rapidly and in less than an hour had been levelled. The firemen succeeded in saving several nearby buildings.
