- l November 1943 by shrapnel, when straffed by enemy planes. Injuries to the above enlisted men were slight and they were treated by the Bn. Surgeon, time approximately 1600. Morale very good.
- 2 November 1943 Btry in position 1 1/2 Miles SW of Ailano, Italy: carrying out normal duties. Enemy planes flew EXE over position about \$\infty\$93\$\$\omega\$ but did not attack. No casualties. Morale excellent.
- Btry left position 1 1/2 miles SW of Ailano, Italy about 1400 and arrived in new position in 1 mile East of Presanzano, Italy at 1530 No enemy action observed. Morale excellent.
