

# Ruin for Czechoslovakia Seen as Price of Peace

**Germany Is Expected to Force Regimented Economic System on Dismembered Nation**

LONDON, Oct. 10. (UPI)—Czechoslovakia grimly weighed the price of the Munich peace today in the light of Chancellor Hitler's remarks Sunday and decided the ultimate spills ruin for the war-battered republic.

With inflation, unemployment system and lowered living standards almost gone, of an uncertain future.

"We are bound to have a state economy," one authoritative Czech told the Star-Bulletin, "but we must rebuild our country."

"We shall need a loan—perhaps \$200,000,000," he said.

This source indicated credit would be given by Germany on much easier terms than those offered by the Reich, "who knows? We may take it from the Reich."

**Much Too Many Impairs**

which to buy imports.
