## Ahukini, Lihue Areas Suitable For New Field

**Pointexter, Cain Return From Flying Survey Of Garden Isle**

Both Ahukini and land mauka of Lihue were found by Louis S. Cain, territorial superintendent of public works, to be desirable sites for a new airport proposed for Kauai, in a survey the territorial official made yesterday on the Garden Isle with Governor Pointexter.

The governor and Cain went to Kauai by plane yesterday morning and returned in the late afternoon. At Lihue they were greeted by members of the Kauai Chamber of Commerce.

Cain made a study of the downtown area of Lihue where Kauai officials and businessmen hope to have a civic center constructed. Plans are now being completed for construction of a new \$80,000 courthouse, for which PWA aid has been assured, and for a new postoffice, as features of the proposed civic center.
