TALK SUBJECT FOR THE DAY: Mrs. Easton gave us a talk on Flower Arrangement. She displayed an arrangement of rose Glads in an aqua shell vase, a single bright red Geranium in a black vase, and a dainty bouquet of violets in a basket.

One of the rules she suggested is, "Never crowd flowers." A single flower, or a few small flowers in an odd container is effective. Another display which all present admired was of yellow single Hibiscus blossoms in a palm seed pod, with a backing of dark Croton leaves.

Nasturtium or Petunia makes a good centerpiece. Mrs. Perkins mentioned a rule which she had found very effective, "Make arrangements so that <sup>they</sup> carry out a triangle, either equilateral or right angle".

It was brought out that a dried Coconut frond makes a good "rack" to display Hibiscus blossoms.

Mrs. Perkins described how to make the native handcraft palm seed pods, with soaking and shaping before varnishing or painting.

Mrs. Jaffee brought a relative of the Monstera to be identified, but with both Mrs. Sheffel and Mrs. Vaughn absent, no one could.
