produced some ramastic action. Wahoo reports have been increasingly improving by boats highspeed trolling current rips and around wrecks in deeper water. Expect this trend to only get better as we get further into the month of February.

On the reef, Capt. Chan Warner aboard the Gulfstream out of Key Largo Fisheries has had another fantastic week off Key Largo. Capt. Chan reported the hot bite this week to be yellowtail snapper 3 to 4 pounds in 130 feet of water off Molasses Reef. Fishing small 1/0 or 2/0 hooks on light 20pound leaders while sandballing dead glass minnows or shrimp in the chum slick have produced a solid bite for his customers. While the kingfish bite slowed a little, several mutton snappers 3 to 6 pounds were caught in 40 to 60 feet of water north and south of Molasses on fresh cut ballyhoo and squid.

Over in the park, the redfish could be found just about everywhere this past week. The average fish measures between 17 and 22 inches, but they are being found in


