

Francis Tracy Garden Center Celebrates 50 Years

In November 2014, Garden Club of the Upper Keys members and invited guests will celebrate the 50th anniversary of the opening of the Francis Tracy Garden Center. The FTGC is the hub of Garden Club activities and proclamation by Monroe County recognizing its place in Upper Keys history will be presented.

The history of the Francis Tracy Garden Center started well before its

construction did. The Upper Keys Garden Club spun-off from the Key Largo Garden Club in 1954. By 1963, the membership had grown and a larger meeting space was needed. Dr. Fred and Margaret Bond offered property on Overseas Highway to build a clubhouse. The Bonds stipulated that it be named the Francis

Tracy Garden Center to honor charter member Francis Tracy for her many contributions to the Garden Club and her conservation leadership.

Building a clubhouse was a major undertaking for the small, nonprofit organization. It held numerous money-raising events to start. An \$8000 mortgage was secured for the balance of the financing. The club's board of directors dug the first shovels of dirt during the groundbreaking ceremony.

The official dedication and public

opening was held in November, 1964. Over 200 members and friends attended. Each club member had been asked to purchase one chair for \$3.75 and 100 were purchased. Over the next three years, the club raised \$8,000 to pay off the mortgage note. In December, 1967, Francis Tracy lit the flame to burn the note for the building named in her honor.

The Upper Keys Garden Club



(now the Garden Club of the Upper Keys) continued to improve and expand the uses of the property. Numerous flower shows, art shows, and design classes have been held there. In 1968, the property was designated a Wild Bird Sanctuary. In 2010, the gardens were declared a Community Peace Park.

The Garden Center looks today pretty much as it did in 1964; there have been no additions or major renovations. A granite cornerstone, salvaged by Rodney Albury from the 1874 wreck of the Mohawk off a reef near Tavernier, was placed in a side wall during construction. This time capsular was opened, reviewed, added to, and resealed in 2007.

The gardens at the Garden Center have evolved through the years under the supervision of dedicated club members. Native trees planted by the charter members now tower over the property. The most recent planting

> renovations were started in 2013 with the implementation of an updated master plan.

Maintenance costs have risen as the building has aged. There have been new roofs, painting inside and out, updated electrical system, and flooring, to name a few. The Garden Center has been and is currently used by other

organizations whose donations help offset maintenance costs. The Club also hosts a Garden Walk every year, with a portion of the proceeds used to maintain the Garden Center.

The Garden Club of the Upper Keys is proud to maintain its historical clubhouse and gardens and it should be.

Visitors can stroll among some of the Upper Keys' most beautiful properties while getting ideas for tropical seascapes Friday, Feb. 28, during the popular annual Garden Walk presented by the Garden Club of the Upper Keys.


Themed "Through the Garden Gate," the Garden Walk includes lush and unique properties between MM 75 and 95. The tropical plantings include mature, naturalized and exotic palms, some 40 feet tall and 100 years old, and fruit and salt-tolerant native trees. One featured garden employs xeriscaping, a landscaping method developed for water conservation.

The private gardens are to be open for self-guided tours between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Most homeowners as well as docents of the garden club, many of them master gardeners, are to be on hand to share plant knowledge.

Driving between featured gardens is required.

Walk participants also are invited to an outdoor garden tea party at the Garden Club's historic Francis Tracy Garden Center, MM 94 in Tavernier, which features local artisans, live music and complimentary refreshments. Other attractions include numerous exhibitor-vendors selling tropical plants, art, honey and natural foodstuffs.
