# 1.0 Introduction, Project Location, and Project Purpose

### 1.1 Introduction

Islamorada's Village Code, combined with Islamorada's status as a Certified Local Government (CLG), mandates a periodic inventory of historic architectural resources. In 2008, Islamorada received a grant from the Florida Department of State, Division of Historical Resources (DHR), to conduct a reconnaissance-level survey of archaeological resources and architectural resources 50 years old or older. This survey was designed to augment and update the results of the previous surveys and identify new cultural resources. Islamorada, Village of Islands, awarded the contract for the survey to GAI Consultants, Inc., (GAI) of Orlando, Florida.

### 1.2 Project Location

Islamorada is located in the upper Florida Keys in Monroe County, Florida, south of Key Largo (Figure 1). Incorporated as a municipality in 1997, Islamorada consists of four keys: Plantation Key, Upper Matecumbe Key, Lower Matecumbe Key, and Windley Key. Key West, the county seat, is located at the southern tip of Monroe County, approximately 80 miles from Islamorada. Islamorada is bordered on the north and west by the Florida Bay and the south and east by the Atlantic Ocean/Straits of Florida. U.S. Route 1 (also known as the Overseas Highway and its former alignment known presently as the Old State Road) proceeds through Islamorada. Islamorada's municipal boundary encompasses the survey area, from Overseas Highway Mile Markers 72.5 to 90.8—an area measuring approximately 3,800 acres (1,537.8 hectares). (Figure 2)

### 1.3 Project Purpose

Islamorada's Planning and Development Services Department initiated this project to compile and present current information on the Village's architectural and archaeological resources. GAI's tasks included: the identification and review of previous surveys and inventories in the survey area; the inventory and assessment of National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) listed historic properties, Monroe County designated landmarks, and previously surveyed Florida Master Site File (FMSF) resources; and a field survey and assessment of all potentially eligible historical structures meeting the 50-year age criterion and previously-recorded archaeological resources. Islamorada Planning and Development Services Department staff requires this information to provide professional direction and reporting to the Historic Preservation Council (HPC) and the Village Council to support decision-making in regard to applications for Historic Designation and Certificates of Appropriateness. The collected information will assist both the HPC and Village Planning staff in the understanding, evaluation, and analysis of alterations, improvements, designation, or demolition of Islamorada's significant cultural resources that may come under their purview.

This survey and report implements certain policies and objectives set forth in the Village's Comprehensive Plan. Among its objectives relating to historical and archaeological sites, the Village's Comprehensive Plan seeks to preserve neighborhood quality and existing housing stock. To that end, Policy 3-1.7.3 provides for the completion of a comprehensive professional survey identifying architecturally and historically significant sites and structures in the Village. Similarly, Policy 3-1.7.4 calls for the identification and preservation of historically significant housing in the Village. The Village's Comprehensive Plan also includes an objective to protect historic resources, and Policy 5-1.13.1 describes how the Village shall promote the identification of the Village's historic, archaeological, and cultural resources by coordinating with the Florida DHR and local historical groups. In the effort to protect archaeological and historical resources, Policy 6-1.12.3 state that the Village will complete a comprehensive professional survey identifying and analyzing potential architectural and historical sites and structures in Islamorada possessing historical significance for inclusion in the Village's list of locally may be viewed at http://www.islamorada.fl.us/newsite/comp\_plan.
