GENERAL MEETING Francis Tracy Garden Center April 16, 2013

Marilyn Rogers, President called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m. and everyone joined in saying the Pledge of Alliance.

Paula Mitchell introduced Julie Mead, our guest speaker. Julie is a past president of the club and a butterfly enthusiast. She has given many informative talks and has also presented to groups as far away as Barbados. We are fortunate to have her with us today as she and her husband have started an a/c business and have been blessed with a very busy schedule.

Today's Speaker: Julie Mead Topic: "Butterfly Gardening"

Beginning a butterfly garden can be as simple as choosing flowering plants that will invite adult butterflies to your garden to feed. If you want them to stay in your garden, you must also provide them with a place to grow and multiply (laying their eggs on host plants).

Did you know? An adult butterfly probably has an average life-span of approximately one month. The smallest butterflies may live only a week or so, while a few butterflies, such as Monarchs, Mourning Cloaks and tropical heliconians, can live up to nine months. Have you noticed the butterfly population has been decreasing over the years?

Most adult butterflies drink nectar from flowers through their tongues, which function much like straws and a minority of butterflies look for sustenance from tree sap, rotting animal matter, and other organic material and when they are ready, most butterflies lay their eggs on plants that will be eaten by the small, emerging caterpillars, when they hatch. Some species lay their eggs on the tops of leafs, some on the bottom, some at the leaf axils, some on flowers, and some on stalks.

Keep the larger host plants placed to the back of your gardens and the smaller flowering plants (nectar/feeding) to the front. In this way you can enjoy both your flowers and the butterflies in your yard instead of them feeding and flying away to find a host plant elsewhere.

Ornamental and garden plants with flowers especially attractive to butterflies include: Butterfly bush, orange milkweed, pentas, zinnia, lantana, plumbago, shrimp plant and many of the asters. A more thorough list of Florida butterflies and their food and nectar plants can be found in IFAS Special Series Fact Sheet SS-WIS-22, Butterfly Gardening In Florida at the Monroe County Extension Service-Murray Nelson Government Center MM102 bayside.

Julie's presentation was excellent, very informative, and everyone enjoyed the slideshow. Hopefully, she has stirred your interest and we can look forward to a few more Butterfly Home Gardens to share on future "Members and Friends Garden Walks". Thank you Julie.
