Cruz, Capt. of the King's ships in the service of Florida, summarizes in detail the all-over situation in Florida, the danger from the English colonies (and French) and offers a plan to improve the defensive situation of Florida. He was captured out of St. Augustine by a British ship in 1740, was imprisoned 4 months in Carolina then shipped for London, eventually to be freed. He recorded valuable information re English design on St. Augustine; mentions Oglethorpe and Georgia ~~topps~~. Cruz plans for privateering were not acceptable to court, but he was placed in the Bardovento fleet with the grade of Lt. (Cruz told the Marques de la Ensenada, secretary to the Infante, that "If Florida was not attended to, the king would lose it," to which the Marques responded that if it be lost, we would have other things of more importance to attend to.....*) He has explored the Florida Keys in light of their importance to treasure fleet routes, wants to do more. Proposes unique plan for gaining Indian allegiances. Mentions arrival of new Govr. Hereallice and names other Florida persons, such as Juan de la Puente, with whom he has discussed his projects.

Endorsement: Madrid, Aug 1, 1775 *

Apparently a draft of letter to Govr. Heredice ~~of Florida~~, suggesting that he and the Govr. of Havana work out Cruz' plan.
