

Questions asked as to how long after flowering the wood rose forms the seed pot. Answer: almost immediately.

Question: Can you grow breadfruit here. Answer: yes, will grow to great heights. Must be protected when young and requires a great deal of water. It will bear fruit here.

Discussion of Buhinia(Lucuma). Blooms from November to March. Newcomb in Homestead has a new one.

Carissa can be air layered. Mrs. Jones suggested that the Copsia is better than Carissa since it has all the advantages but no thorns. It is salt resisting, has fruit, and can be grown from seed or by air layering.

Discussion of Ties or egg fruit. This is a nice tree to have and the fruit varies. It can be eaten raw or baked like squash. (leucuma nervosa)

Discussion of fishtail palms. Be sure to remove all dead leaves.

Discussion of Christmas palms(adonidia merillii). Must be protected a bit.

Mr. Ellis suggested that members might be interested in learning how to make a totē pole for vines.
