Introduction

This archaeological and historical assessment was conducted in response to an "order to correct violation" issued by Collier County's Compliance Services on April 24, 1997. The specific correction action required by the County was that "a certified archaeologist contracted by the property owner shall prepare a historical/archaeological survey and assessment in accordance with sections 2.2.25.4.1 and 2.2.25.4.2".

This field survey was conducted on May 25, 1997, using a three person archaeological crew. All significant archaeological features were recorded and located on a field map. Boundaries of the prehistoric archaeological site were marked with pin flags with each flag marked with sequential numbers along a "A" and "B" line (see figure 1).
