## AWARDS

The Standard System of Awarding shall be used. There will be only one First (Blue); one Second (Red); one Third (Yellow) and one Honorable Mention (White) if entries so warrant.

TRI-COLOR (Blue-Red-Yellow if merited, to best Blue Ribbon in Classes 1,2,4,6,10,11,13.

CREATIVITY AWARD (Purple Rosette) if merited, to best Blue Ribbon in Classes 3,7,8,9,14.

AWARD OF DISTINCTION (Brown Rosette) if merited, to best Blue Ribbon in Classes 5,12,15.

## AWARDS, cont.

TWO SWEEPSTAKES AWARD (Green and White Rosette) one in Artistic Division and one in Horticulture Division, to be awarded to exhibitor winning highest number of blue ribbons in each division.

\*THREE AWARDS OF MERIT (Orange Ribbon) one in Cut Specimens, one for Blooming Potted Plants and one for Non-Blooming Potted Plants.

ARBOREAL AWARD (Two Shades of Green) if merited, in Tree or Shrub Section. These specimens or collections of specimens may be shown for the beauty of the flower, the fruit or the foliage.

EDUCATIONAL AWARD (Brown and White Rosette) if merited to best Educational display.

SEVERAL AWARDS OF APPRECIATION (Orchid Rosette) for Non-Competitive Design Exhibits.

JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS (Red-White-and Blue Ribbon) one in each Section Artistic, Horticulture and Educational, of the Junior Division.

The Tri-Color Award, Creativity Award, Award of Distinction, Award of Merit, and the Arboreal Award are of equal value. The minimum grade for these awards shall be 95 or higher.

## GENERAL RULES

1. Each exhibitor is allowed one entry in each class, but may enter as many classes as desired.
2. All property must be marked with name of exhibitor.
3. Late entries in competitive classes will be received but marked "Not in Competition".

4. All exhibitors must be out of the building by 11:00 A.M. on Saturday, March 24th. Those officials with specific duties must be out of the building by 12:00 noon. While judging is in progress, only judges and proper officials of the Show will be allowed on the floor.

5. The building will be open Sunday at 10:00 A.M. for replacement and watering of exhibits.

6. Native plants on the Florida Conservation List may be used, provided they have been grown by the exhibitor or otherwise legally obtained.

7. The Classification Committees reserve the privilege to disqualify entries not conforming to the schedule or entries of inferior quality.

8. Exhibits MAY NOT be removed before 8:00 P.M. Sunday, March 25th and MUST be removed by 8:00 A.M. Monday, March 26th.

The Garden Club of Indian River County does not assume liability for damage, loss of personal property, or personal injury.

## ARTISTIC DIVISION RULES

1. Artistic Classes open to Federated Garden Club members only.
2. Each Circle will be responsible for 6 designated entries. Circle Flower Show Chairmen shall obtain these entries, and register them (In Writing) with the entries Chairman not later than March 5th.
3. After entry has been pledged, exhibitor MUST provide a substitute if unable to exhibit.
4. All entries must be cleared through the Classification Committee before placement.
5. All exhibits for Artistic Division will be entered between 8:00 A.M. and 10:30 A.M. on Saturday, March 24th.
6. Judges are requested to leave comments on all exhibits except Blue Ribbon winners.



# ARTISTIC DIVISION RULES, cont.

7. A note of explanation may be placed with the exhibit, card to be 3 x 5 typed or neatly printed.
8. All material must be correctly named, and listed on 3 x 5 card.
9. ARRANGEMENT MUST BE THE WORK OF EXHIBITOR.
10. Substitute backgrounds permitted in all niche classes. Sides may or may not be covered, as desired. THESE SUBSTITUTE BACKGROUNDS MUST BE IN PLACE BEFORE 8:00 P.M. ON FRIDAY, MARCH 23rd. Bases and accessories permitted in all classes, and accessories may be used in any way.
11. All niches will be 39 inches from the floor, 32 inches high, 29 inches wide and 18 inches deep.
13. All pedestals will be 40 inches high and no part of the arrangement will be allowed to extend below the top of the pedestal. Top of pedestal is 18 inches square.
14. There will be 4 entries in each class.
15. There are no restrictions as to clipping or trimming materials.
16. No artificial flowers, fruit or foliage may be used.
17. In classes eligible for Tri-Color Award, the Exhibit must consist of All Fresh Plant Material. One or more Accessories permitted, but Emphasis to be on plant material.
18. In classes eligible for Award of Distinction, the exhibit must consist of all dried material. The material used may be naturally dried, treated (with dye, shellac, glycerine and/or paint), or dried tinted material or any combination of these dried materials. One or more accessories permitted, but Emphasis to be on plant material.
19. In classes eligible for The Creativity Award, the exhibit must consist of fresh and/or dried material, accessories may be used.

TAHITI....."LAND OF POLYNESIAN ENCHANT-  
MENT"  
A floor design, using some tropical plant material not less than 60 inches high, overall. Eligible for Tri-Color.

Class 2

ENGLAND....."LAND OF KINGS AND QUEENS"  
An early Victorian Period arrangement, displayed on a pedestal. Eligible for Tri-Color.

Class 3

TURKEY....."LAND OF MOSQUE AND MINARETS"  
A vertical design, displayed on a pedestal. Eligible for Creativity Award.

Class 4

GREECE....."LAND OF ART AND CULTURE"  
A design of classical beauty and dignity, displayed on a pedestal. Eligible for Tri-Color.

Class 5

PERU....."LAND OF THE INCAS' LOST CITY OF MACHU PICCHU"  
A design using some rocks or stones, displayed in a niche. Eligible for Award of Distinction.

Class 6

MEXICO....."LAND OF THE MARKET PLACE"  
An artistic design using fruit and/or vegetables, some other plant material may be used, displayed in a niche. Eligible for Tri-Color.

Class 7

CONGO....."LAND OF ADVENTURE AND SAFARIS"  
A mass line design depicting African jungles, displayed in a niche. Eligible for Creativity Award.

Class 8

JAPAN....."LAND OF TEMPLES AND PAGODAS"  
A line design showing the Oriental influence, displayed in a niche. Eligible for Creativity Award.

Class 9

ISRAEL....."LAND WHERE PAST AND PRESENT MEET"  
An interpretive design showing religious influence, name the religion. Displayed on a pedestal. Eligible for Creativity Award.

Class 10

FRANCE....."LAND OF INTRIGUE"  
A delicate design of the French Rococo period, displayed on a pedestal. Eligible for Tri-Color.

Class 11

AUSTRIA....."LAND OF CASTLES AND FAIRY-  
TALE VILLAGES"  
A conventional design, displayed on a pedestal. Eligible for Tri-Color.

Class 12

BAHAMAS....."LAND OF THE BLUE-GREEN SEA"  
A design using some material from the sea, other dried plant material permitted, displayed in a niche. Eligible for Award of Distinction.

Class 13

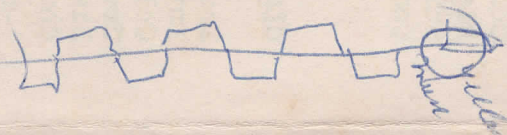
SPAIN....."LAND OF TOREADORS AND MANTILLAS"  
An expressive design using bright colors, displayed in a niche. Eligible for Tri-Color.

Class 14

EGYPT....."LAND OF PYRAMIDS AND SPHINX"  
A symmetrical design, displayed in a niche. Eligible for Creativity Award.

Class 15

MOROCCO....."LAND OF DESERT AND CAMELS"  
A design symbolic of the desert, displayed in a niche. Eligible for Award of Distinction.
