AWARDS:

THE STANDARD SYSTEM SHALL BE USED. THERE WILL BE ONLY ONE FIRST (BLUE); ONE SECOND (RED); ONE THIRD (YELLOW); AND ONE OR MORE HONORABLE MENTION RIBBONS (WHITE), TRICOLOR (BLUE, RED AND YELLOW ROSETTE) IF MERITED. (BEST BLUE IN CLASSES 1-5, ALL FRESH MATERIAL). AWARD OF MERIT (ORANGE ROSETTE) SCORING OVER NINETY FIVE.

ONE FOR BEST SECTION D - FERNS ONE FOR BEST SECTION E - AROIDS
ONE FOR BEST SECTION B - BROMELIA ONE FOR BEST SECTION C - ORCHIDS

TWO SWEEPSTAKE AWARDS (GREEN AND WHITE ROSETTE) ONE IN HORTICULTURE AND ONE IN ARTISTIC FOR EXHIBITOR WINNING THE HIGHEST NUMBER OF BLUE RIBBONS IN EACH DIVISION.

EDUCATIONAL AWARD (BROWN AND WHITE ROSETTE) TO AN EDUCATIONAL EXHIBIT IF MERITED.

GENERAL RULES:

1. COMPETITION IS OPEN TO ALL GARDEN CLUB MEMBERS AS WELL AS AMATEUR GARDENERS AND ARRANGERS.
2. ONE ENTRY PER PERSON PER CLASS IS ALLOWED. AS MANY CLASSES AS DESIRED MAY BE ENTERED.
3. ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE IN PLACE BY 9:30 AM, FEBRUARY 22, 1980. CLUB WILL BE OPEN AT 8:00 AM TO PERMIT SET-UP OF FRESH DISPLAY.
4. POTTED PLANTS, DRY ARRANGEMENTS, OR ANY OTHER EXHIBIT WHICH WILL SUFFER NO EFFECT FROM EARLY PLACEMENT SHOULD BE BROUGHT IN BY THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 21, BETWEEN 10:00 AM AND 4:00 PM.
5. SIX ENTRIES IN EACH ARTISTIC DIVISION.
6. EXHIBITS MAY NOT BE REMOVED BEFORE 4:00 PM, FEBRUARY 23, 1980.
7. LATE ENTRIES WILL BE RECEIVED, BUT WILL BE MARKED "NOT IN COMPETITION".
8. NO ARTIFICIAL FLOWERS OR FOLIAGE MAY BE USED. CONTRIVED, TREATED OR SPRAYED MATERIAL MAY BE USED IN CLASS 6-B AND 7-B.
9. PLANTS ON STATE CONSERVATION LIST MAY BE USED IN ARRANGEMENTS, ONLY IF GROWN BY EXHIBITOR.
10. ALL DECISIONS OF THE JUDGES ARE FINAL.
11. ONLY AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE BUILDING AFTER 9:30 AM UNTIL JUDGING IS COMPLETED.
12. UPPER KEYS GARDEN CLUB WILL NOT ASSUME LIABILITY FOR DAMAGE TO OR LOSS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY OR FOR PERSONAL INJURY.

ARTISTIC DIVISION RULES:

1. FLOWERS AND FOLIAGE USED NEED NOT BE GROWN BY EXHIBITOR. (*EXCEPTION, SEE GENERAL RULES No. 9).
2. ENTRIES MUST BE THE WORK OF THE EXHIBITOR.
3. PLANT MATERIAL USED SHOULD BE LISTED ON 3" x 5" CARD.
4. ACCESSORIES IN CLASSES II AND IV PERMITTED. BASES AND BACKGROUNDS MAY BE USED IN ALL CLASSES.
5. BACKGROUNDS AND FASTENING MATERIAL MAY NOT BE VISIBLE ON OPPOSITE SIDE OF FURNISHED SPACE.
6. ARRANGEMENTS ARE NOT TO EXCEED 20" WIDE, 30" HIGH, 15" DEEP.
7. WILTED FLOWERS IN ANY ARRANGEMENT SHOULD BE REPLACED ON SATURDAY AT 9:30 AM WITH MATERIAL AS NEAR AS POSSIBLE TO THE ORIGINAL.

Flower Show Award

SECTION A - ARTISTIC DESIGN ARRANGEMENTS:

CLASSES 1-5

ELIGIBLE FOR TRI-COLOR, ALL FRESH CUT PLANT MATERIAL REQUIRED.

CLASS I

"KEYS SUNSETS" - ALL CUT PLANT MATERIAL, ACCENT ON COLOR, HARMONY AND FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION.

CLASS II

"SEA WINDS" - ALL CUT PLANT MATERIAL. ACCENT ON CREATIVITY ONE OR MORE ACCESSORIES MAY BE USED.

CLASS III

"TROPICAL FOLIAGE" - ONLY FOLIAGE - NO BLOOMS. ACCENT ON COLOR AND DESIGN.

CLASS IV

"IN THE JAPANESE MANNER" - DESIGN FOR ENTRANCE WALL.

CLASS V

"MANTELPIECE" - NOVICE CLASS, PEDISTAL DISPLAY, ACCENT ON DESIGN.

SECTION B

CLASS VI

MINIATURE - NOT TO EXCEED 3" HIGH, 3" WIDE.
A. ALL FRESH CUT PLANT MATERIAL
B. ALL DRIED PLANT MATERIAL

CLASS VII

SMALL ARRANGEMENTS - NOT TO EXCEED 8" HIGH, 5" WIDE.
A. ALL FRESH CUT PLANT MATERIAL
B. ALL DRIED PLANT MATERIAL

HORTICULTURAL DIVISION RULES:

1. SPECIMEN PLANT CONTAINERS SHOULD BE NEAT AND CLEAN.
2. POTTED PLANTS MUST HAVE BEEN IN THE POSSESSION OF THE EXHIBITOR FOR NINETY DAYS OR MORE.
3. LEAVES MUST BE FREE OF RESIDUE, BUT NOT OILED. NO INSECT DAMAGED LEAVES.
4. ENTRY TAGS MUST SHOW BOTANICAL AND COMMON NAME.
5. CONTAINERS WILL BE FURNISHED FOR CUT SPECIMENTS. SIZE OF SPECIMENS SHOULD NOT EXCEED 18".
6. AN EXHIBITOR MAY MAKE MORE THAN ONE ENTRY IN A CLASS, PROVIDED THAT EACH ENTRY IS IN A DIFFERENT SECTION OF THE CLASS.
7. CUT FLOWERS MUST CONSIST OF THREE BLOOMS PER CONTAINER EXCEPT; ONE ROSE, ONE ORCHID, ONE ALOE, ONE GLADIOLA, ONE HIBISCUS.
8. ROSES MUST BE SHOWN WITH FOLIAGE.
