

Erwin Fuchs 1915 to 1998

Born in Vienna, Austria 11/17/1915 (Jewish, Hungarian Nationality)

Lived in Sopron, Hungary 1915-1939 (Graduated HS in 1934. Textile designer and mandatory service in Hungarian Army)

Hitlers rise to power and imminent invasion. Erwin's family did not survive.

French Foreign Legion 1939-1944 (Sergeant. Served in Algiers, Morocco, Senegal, and Tunis. Joined with twin brother who later died with wife in a boat accident)

Married to Gertrud 1945 (Divorced)

British Army 1944-1947 (Sergeant. Served in N. Africa, Italy, and England)

Son, Richard, born 1949

Ecuador, South America 1947-1950 (Industrial first aid man for Shell Oil in Amazon jungle)

New Jersey, USA 1950-1970 (Electronics draftsman for ITT and Bendix. Operating room scrub tech)

Israel 1970-1980 (Electronics draftsman for Israeli Aircraft Industries)

Seattle, USA 1980-1998 (Retired, worked at Pipelane, and volunteered at Swedish Hospital)

Died in Seattle 8/6/1998 (Complications after being run over by bus at intersection next to his apartment)
