PRINCIPLES OF THE LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS

- The League of Women Voters believes in representative government and in the individual liberties established in the Constitution of the United States.
- The League of Women Voters believes that democratic government depends upon the informed and active participation of its citizens and requires that governmental bodies protect the citizen's right to know by giving adequate notice of proposed actions, holding open meetings and making public records accessible.
- The League of Women Voters believes that every citizen should be protected in the right to vote; that every person should have access to free public education which provides equal opportunity for all; and that no person or group should suffer legal, economic or administrative discrimination.
- The League of Women Voters believes that efficient and economical government requires competent personnel, the clear assignment of responsibility, adequate financing and coordination among the different agencies and levels of government.
- The League of Women Voters believes that responsible government should be responsive to the will of the people; that government should maintain an equitable and flexible system of taxation, promote the conservation and development of natural resources in the public interest, share in the solution of economic and social problems which affect the general welfare, promote a sound economy and adopt domestic policies which facilitate the solution of international problems.
- The League of Women Voters believes that cooperation with other nations is essential in the search for solutions to world problems, and that the development of international law is imperative in the promotion of world peace.

HOW THE LEAGUE FUNCTIONS

The League takes ACTION on governmental policies and measures in the public interest in conformity with the principles of the League of Women Voters of the U.S. After thorough study it provides information, influences public opinion and supports or opposes legislation. TIME FOR ACTION occurs when League members are asked to express support or opposition on a position after study and general agreement by all Leagues affected by the proposed legislation. CONSENSUS is the term used to indicate membership agreement on an issue. It is determined by the Board after evaluating membership opinion. A LEAGUE POSITION is that body of opinion expressed in consensus appropriately worded by the League Board.

All citizens 18 years of age or older are invited to join. Membership in a local League automatically extends to membership in the County, State and National Leagues.

NONPARTISAN POLITICAL POLICY (Revised May 12, 1980)

The purpose of the League of Women Voters of the United States is to promote political responsibility through informed and active participation of citizens in government. The League is a nonpartisan organization. It takes action on selected governmental issues which are in the public interest. It does not support or oppose any political party or candidate. The League believes that participation in the activities of our political parties is an essential ingredient of citizen responsibility and urges all citizens to work in the party of their choice.

The League of Women Voters of Lake Forest subscribes fully to these principles as the foundation for its nonpartisan political policy.

- A. GENERAL MEMBERS, other than Board members are encouraged to participate in any political party or governmental activity, provided they act as individuals and not in the name of the League.
- B. BOARD MEMBERS may accept appointment to nonpartisan boards, commissions and committees provided there is no identification with a political party or any conflict with League policy. They may sign nominating petitions for candidates and attend bi-partisan and partisan candidate meetings. No Board member may be a candidate for public office or engage publicly on an issue which is in conflict with the League position or which might lead to community misunderstanding on the League position.
- C. BOARD MEMBERS IN PUBLICLY SENSITIVE POSITIONS, i.e. the President, Voters Service Chairman, Action Chairman, and any others so determined by the Board, are more restricted. Their frequent exposure to the community and the tendency of the public to equate their actions with the League position makes this distinction necessary. They may not participate in the following activities which are open to Board members in less sensitive positions:
 1. Serve a political party or political candidate by
 - a) participating in any public activity which promotes a particular candidate or party, e.g. circulating petitions for, sponsoring meetings for, or otherwise publicly expressing a preference for a candidate.
 - b) working as a precinct committee person
 - c) acting as a clerk or judge of election
 2. Serve on a caucus which selects and supports candidates.
- D. Resignation. If a Board member questions a situation in which he or she may be in conflict with the Nonpartisan Political Policy, that member is encouraged to present the situation to the Board for a determination. When a conflict exists the Board member will be asked to resign. The resigned Board member retains membership in the League and is eligible for reappointment to the League Board at the time when his or her partisan activities are completed.
- E. The responsibility for interpretation and application of this policy remains with the League Board.
