PRINCIPLES OF THE LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS

The League of Women Voters believes in representative government and in the individual liberties established in the Constitution of the United States of America.

The League of Women Voters believes that democratic government depends upon the informed and active participation of its citizens and requires that governmental bodies protect the citizen's right to know by giving adequate notice of proposed actions, holding open meetings and making public records accessible.

The League of Women Voters believes that every citizen should be protected in the right to vote; that every person should have access to free public education which provides equal opportunity for all; and that no person or group should suffer legal, economic or administrative discrimination.

The League of Women Voters believes that efficient and economical government requires competent personnel, the clear assignment of responsibility, adequate financing and coordination among the different agencies and levels of government.

The League of Women Voters believes that responsible government should be responsive to the will of the people; that government should maintain an equitable and flexible system of taxation, promote the conservation and development of natural resources in the public interest, share in the solution of economic and social problems which affect the general welfare, promote a sound economy and adopt domestic policies which facilitate the solution of international problems.

The League of Women Voters believes that cooperation with other nations is essential in the search for solutions to world problems, and the development of international law is imperative in the promotion of world peace.

HOW THE LEAGUE FUNCTIONS

The League takes ACTION on governmental policies and measures in the public interest in conformity with principles of the League of Women Voters of the U.S. After thorough study, it provides information, influences public opinion and supports or opposes legislation. TIME FOR ACTION occurs when League members are asked to express support or opposition on a position after study and general agreement by all Leagues affected by the proposed legislation. CONSENSUS is the term used to indicate membership agreement on an issue. It is determined by the Board after evaluating membership opinion. A LEAGUE POSITION is that body of opinion expressed in consensus appropriately worded by the League Board.

All citizens 18 years of age or older are invited to join. Membership in a local League automatically extends to membership in the County, State and National Leagues.

PROGRAMS 1968 -1969

LOCAL:

1. Continued attention to youth problems in Lake Forest, and related services including support of CROYA (Committee Representing Our Young Adults). Continued observations of the CROYA goals and objectives.
2. Support of the 1978 Lake Forest Comprehensive Plan with continuing attention to land use, local environmental pollution, zoning, recreation and safety.
 - a. Support of action to ban leaf burning in Lake Forest.
 - b. Continued attention to the housing needs of retirees and empty nesters.
3. Continued attention to the needs of young children in Lake Forest including, but not limited to:
 - a. Revision and re-publication of the pre-school booklet.
 - b. Support of the Day Care Position, including support of the Drop-In Center.
 - c. Attention to the Lake Forest pre-school population study and survey.
4. Study of the need for additional pet control regulation: a leash law and a pet waste ordinance. Examine the current pet control regulations and assess the need for additional regulations to promote public safety, health and welfare.
5. Study by Lake Forest Government by means of an Observer Corps.

COUNTY:

1. Task force to study possible forms of County Government, concur with existing League position and/or formulate a preferred form and seek agreement from member Leagues. This is to address the issues of a possible referendum in Lake County which might result in reduction of County Board and/or election of Chairman-at-Large.
2. Continued study of the Forest Preserve District of Lake County.
3. Lake County League will coordinate the LWVUS National Studies with members of the seven Leagues in Lake County.
4. Support of positions on:
 - a. Watershed Management
 - b. Land use in Lake County
 - c. Solid Waste Disposal
 - d. Concurrence with Des Plaines LWV Consensus re: Aircraft Noise Pollution
 - e. Lake County Jail Task Force
 - f. Hazardous Waste Task Force

STATE:

1. **Marital Law:** Support for laws which recognize marriage as an economic partnership and for a divorce process which is fair and equitable to all parties with regard to property division, maintenance, custody and child support.
2. **Fiscal Policies:** Support for a diversified and equitable revenue system that provides adequate support for state and local governments, schools, human services and furthers League environmental and land use goals.
3. **Schools and Education:** Support of a public school system that is equitable both in quality for the student and financing for the taxpayer.
4. **Land Use:** Support for a state land use policy that addresses problem of conflicting uses for the land resources of Illinois.
5. **Election Laws:** Support of improved election laws and procedures.
6. **Constitutional Implementation and Amendments:** Support for League positions to implement, amend and uphold the 1970 Constitution.
7. **Child Welfare/Juvenile System:** Support of improved services of Illinois state agencies serving children and their families.
8. **Criminal Justice:** Support of improved criminal justice procedures in Illinois and alternatives to incarceration.
9. **Mental Health:** A study to assess the level of mental health services being provided in the community and to determine directions that can be taken to improve the mental health system. (Contingent on receiving necessary funding.)

NATIONAL:

1. **Government:** Promote an open governmental system that is representative, accountable, responsive; that protects individual liberties established by the Constitution; and that assures opportunities for citizen participation in government decision making.
• Citizen Rights • Congress and the Presidency • DC Self-Government and Full Voting Representation • Election Process • Voting Rights • Financing the Federal Government • Financing the Federal Government • Evaluate U.S. Fiscal Policy revenue sources including borrowing; tax expenditures; and the funding of entitlement programs.
2. **International Relations:** Promote peace in an interdependent world through cooperation with other nations, the

strengthening of international organizations, arms control measures and the resolution of conflict without the use of military force.

National Security: Examine the interdependent nature of International Relations Program, including new and innovative ways to promote global security. Evaluate U.S. economic and military aid to developing countries and its relationship to our international economic and political interests.

POLITICAL ACTIVITY AND CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICIES

Adopted by national board, June 1984 (Includes Non-partisanship policies adopted June 1980)

POLITICAL ACTIVITY POLICY

1. The President shall not run for any elective office. Board of members shall not run for national elective office, but may run for state or local office regardless of party designation after consultation with the national board and the presidents of the state and local Leagues involved.
2. The president shall not serve in any positions in a political party. Board members shall not serve in political party positions at the national level and shall abide by their state League's political activity policy regarding holding state and local party positions.
3. Board members may attend fund-raising events and make campaign contributions.
4. Board members may not chair or administer fund-raising or political campaigns, chair a campaign event, or work in a significant way in the campaign of a candidate for national office. Board members may undertake such activities for candidates for state or local office after consultations with the presidents of the state and local Leagues involved.
5. Board members should present questions about specific situations to the national board where the foregoing policies do not resolve the questions.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY

1. The board should encourage and assist LNW members to secure appointments to government boards, commissions and committees.
2. Board members may serve on advisory boards except in cases where a dual identity (LNW/other responsibilities) may cause problems, confusion, etc. in the board member's responsibilities to the League. If a serious conflict of interest arises between the two entities, the board member must make a choice between the two.
3. Board members shall not lobby for a position in opposition to or in conflict with a LNWUS position, except that board members have the right as individuals to lobby their own MC's on any side of any issue. In doing so, they must make it clear they are not representing the LNW. Board members shall follow the current guidelines for determination of conflict of interest in lobbying.
4. If a conflict of interest problem arises from employment, it should be brought to the board.
5. Board members may not accept stipends or grants for League projects while sitting on the policy-making board which is responsible for administering the grant.
6. Board members may accept honoraria.
