The League of Momen Voters believes that efficient and economical government requires competent personnel, the clear smallgament of responsibility, adequate financing and coordination among the different species and levels of government.

# POLITICAL ACTIVITY AND CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICIES

Adopted by national board, June 1984 (Includes Non-particements policies adopted June 1980)

# POLITICAL ACTIVITY POLICY

- The President shall not run for any elective office. Board of scabers shall not run for national elective office, but may run for state or local office regardless of party designation after consultation with the national board and the presidents of the state and local leagues involved.
- The president shell not serve in any positions in a political party. Board members shall not serve in political party positions at the national level and shall shide by their state League's political activity policy regarding holding state and local party positions.
- Board members may attend fund-raising events and make campaign
- 4. Board members say not chair or administer fundrasising or political campaigns, chair a capasign event, or work in a significant with the capasign of a candidate for national candidates for atate or local office after consultations with the gredients of the atate and local Leagues involved.
- Board members should present questions about specific situations to the national board where the foregoing policies do not resolve the questions.

#### CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY

- The board should encourage and assist LWV members to secure appointments to government boards, commissions and committees.
   Board members may serve on advisory boards except in cases where a dual identity (LWV/other responsibilities) may cause
- where a dual identity (LW/other responsibilities) may cause problems, confusion, etc. in the board member's responsibilities to the League. If a merious conflict of interest srises between the two entities, the board member must make a choice between the two.
- 3. Noard members shall not lobby for a position in opposition to or in conditiet with a LWUS position, except that beard members have the right as individuals, to lobby their own NC's on any side of any issue. In doing no, they wast waske it follow the color representing the LWY. Board sembers shall follow the color presenting the law. Board sembers shall follow the color properties for determination of conflict of interest in lobbying.
- If a conflict of interest problem arises from employment, it should be brought to the board.
- 5. Board members may not accept stipends or grants for League projects while sitting on the policy-making board which is responsible for administering the grant.
- 6. Board members may accept honoraris.
