1. WEST LAKE FOREST TRAIN STATION

The train station was completed in 1992. The two gardens at the front of the station were planned and planted by members of the Deerpath Garden Club in June 1993 as an ongoing project, to both beautify the area and provide a learning experience for the members who, also, maintain them. The kidney shaped gardens are planted with perennial flowers, grasses and bulbs to provide ongoing seasonal bloom. Annuals are added to provide additional color. Planted for the second year is the new variety of Petunia, 'Purple Wave'. The garden club received an Award for Civic Beautification from the City of Lake Forest for the project.

2. BARBARA AND GERALD SCHULTZ  
694 S. Ridge Rd., Lake Forest

The house was built in 1978 on a part of the General Woods estate. The gardens, established in 1983 by Barbara, are long and narrow on an East-West axis. Patio containers, planted with annuals and perennials, are adjacent to a hosta and impatiens garden which leads to the terrace. Featured here is a knot garden. To the west of the terrace is a meadow garden designed by Mary Walker. A secret garden is located west of the meadow.

Parking: There is no parking along Ridge Rd. Please park along the driveway or along the north side of the private road. DO NOT PARK ON THE GRASS.
