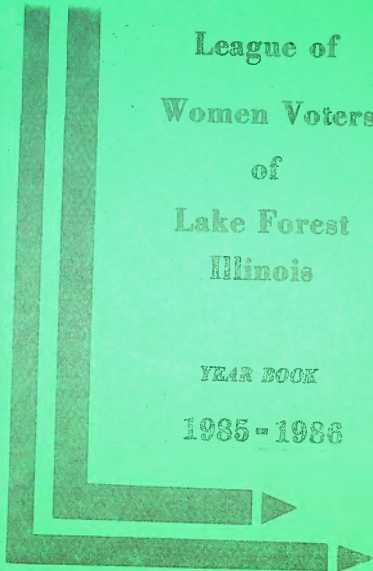

PRINCIPLES OF THE LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS

The League of Women Voters believes in representative government and in the individual liberties established in the Constitution of the United States.

The League of Women Voters believes that democratic government depends upon the informed and active participation of its citizens and requires that governmental bodies protect the citizen's right to know by giving adequate notice of proposed actions, holding open meetings and making public records accessible.

The League of Women Voters believes that every citizen should be protected in the right to vote; that every person should have access to free public education which provides equal opportunity for all; and that no person or group should suffer legal, economic or administrative discrimination.

The League of Women Voters believes that efficient and economical government requires competent personnel, the clear assignment of responsibility, adequate financing and coordination among the different agencies and levels of government.

The League of Women Voters believes that responsible government should be responsive to the will of the people; that government should maintain an equitable and flexible system of taxation, promote the conservation and development of natural resources in the public interest, share in the solution of economic and social problems which affect the general welfare, promote a sound economy and adopt domestic policies which facilitate the solution of international problems.

The League of Women Voters believes that cooperation with other nations is essential in the search for solutions to world problems, and that the development of international law is imperative in the promotion of world peace.

HOW THE LEAGUE FUNCTIONS

The League takes ACTION on governmental policies and measures in the public interest in conformity with the principles of the League of Women Voters or the U.S. After thorough study it provides information, influences public opinion and supports or opposes legislation. TIME FOR ACTION occurs when League members are asked to express support or opposition on a position after study and general agreement by all Leagues affected by the proposed legislation. CONSENSUS is the term used to indicate membership agreement on an issue. It is determined by the Board after evaluating membership opinion. A LEAGUE POSITION is that body of opinion expressed in consensus appropriately voiced by the League Board.

All citizens 18 years of age or older are invited to join. Membership in a local League automatically extends to membership in the County, State and National Leagues.

PROGRAM

- Continued attention to youth problems in Lake Forest and related services including support of CROTA (Committee Representing Our Young Adults). Continued observation of the CROTA goals and objectives.
- Support of the 1978 Lake Forest Comprehensive Plan with continuing attention to land use, local environmental pollution, zoning, recreation and safety.
 - Support of action to ban leaf burning in Lake Forest.
 - Continued study of the housing needs of retirees and empty-nesters.
 - Study of the amendments to the 1978 Comprehensive Plan, with the intention of developing criteria for support of the Comprehensive Plan and amendments to it.
- Continued attention to the Lake Forest Census System.
- Study of Child Care Services and Facilities for Pre-School Children in Lake Forest. (Scope: Study to assess the level of need for such service/facilities and to examine facilities and options available in the community to meet the need.)
- Study of the need for additional pet-control regulations: a leash law and a pet-waste ordinance. (Scope: Examine the current pet-control regulations and assess the need for additional regulation to promote public safety, health, and welfare.)

POLITICAL ACTIVITY AND CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICIES

Adopted by national board, June 1964 (includes Non-partisanship policies adopted June 1960)

POLITICAL ACTIVITY POLICY

1. The president shall not run for any elective office. Board members shall not run for national elective office, but may run for state or local office regardless of party designation after consultation with the national board and the presidents of the state and local leagues involved.
2. The president shall not serve in any positions in a political party. Board members shall not serve in political party positions at the national level and shall abide by their state league's political activity policy regarding holding state and local party positions.
3. Board members may attend fund-raising events and make campaign contributions.
4. Board members may not chair or administer fund-raising or political campaigns, chair a campaign event, or work in a significant way in the campaign of a candidate for national office. Board members may undertake such activities for candidates for state or local office after consultations with the presidents of the state and local leagues involved.
5. Board members should present questions about specific situations to the national board where the foregoing policies do not resolve the question.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY

1. The board should encourage and assist LMY members to secure appointments to government boards, commissions and committees.
2. Board members may serve on advisory boards except in cases where a dual identity (LMV/other responsibilities) may cause problems, confusion, etc. in the board member's responsibilities to the Leagues. If a serious conflict arises between the two entities, the board member must make a choice between the two.
3. Board members shall not lobby for a position in opposition to or in conflict with a LMYUS position, except that board members have the right as individuals, to lobby their own NCs on any side of any issue. In doing so, they must make it clear they are not representing the LMY. Board members shall follow the current guidelines for determination of conflict of interest in lobbying.
4. If a conflict of interest problem arises from employment, it should be brought to the board.
5. Board members may not accept stipends or grants for League projects while sitting on the policy-making board which is responsible for administering the grant.
6. Board members may accept honoraria.
