HOW THE LEAGUE FUNCTIONS

The League takes ACTION on governmental policies and measures in the public interest in conformity with the principles of the League of Women Voters of the U.S. After thorough study it provides information, influences public opinion and supports or opposes legislation. TIME FOR ACTION occurs when League members are asked to express support or opposition on a position after study and general agreement by all Leagues affected by the proposed legislation. CONSENSUS is the term used to indicate membership agreement on an issue. It is determined by the Board after evaluating membership opinion. A LEAGUE POSITION is that body of opinion expressed in consensus appropriately worded by the League Board.

MEMBERSHIP

All women citizens 18 years of age or older are invited to join. Membership in a local League automatically extends to membership in the County, State and National Leagues. There are approximately 157,000 members in the U.S. and over 170 in the Lake Forest League.

LEAGUE MEETINGS

General Meetings are held to present an expert speaker on some part of the League program or to provide an opportunity for general discussion or action.

Unit Meetings are small discussion groups to which the study done in Resource Committee Meetings is brought for your consideration. These meetings were designed to bring the program closer to the individual member and to facilitate reaching League consensus. The Discussion Leader makes it possible for all members to participate in an orderly and satisfying manner. Representatives from the Resource Committee are responsible for providing enough facts so that discussion may be informed, accurate, and profitable.

MEMBERSHIP PARTICIPATION

The League functions most effectively, and the member develops in citizenship, when she participates actively in the work of the League. It is hoped that she will wish to join a resource committee, but in any event her presence at Unit and General Membership Meetings is essential if a true Consensus is to be reached. This year Unit Meetings will be held on Monday and Tuesday mornings. You are welcome to attend the meeting most convenient for you.

LOCAL CURRENT AGENDA 1972-1973

A study of the Lake Forest Master Plan with emphasis on recreation and safety.

LOCAL CONTINUING RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Continued study of Lake Forest City Planning with attention focused on land use and local environmental pollution. Action as indicated.
2. Continued attention to public education for Lake Forest, including elementary schools, the high school, and a junior college, with action as indicated.
3. Publication of the League's "Know Your Town" book.

LAKE COUNTY LWV PROGRAM 1972-1973

1. Study of health care facilities and programs in Lake County, and evaluation of proposals for improvement.
2. Evaluation of Lake County governmental structure.

STATE PROGRAM 1971-1973

1. Constitutional revision and implementation.
 - a. Initiation and support of legislation to implement the 1970 Constitution in areas of League consensus.
 - b. Action to achieve other consensus positions not embodied in the 1970 Constitution.
2. Support of measures to improve the structure and operation of local government, including support of improved structure and financing of public schools and the establishment of a State task force to gather information on County government for local League use.
3. Protection of the individual's civil rights and liberties.
 - a. Support of legislation to provide equal opportunities in housing, professional and commercial real estate and education.
 - b. Preservation of Constitutional liberties, focusing on the problems of the erosion of civil liberties.
4. Support of improved state-wide Day Care services to Illinois children and their families.
5. Improved election laws and procedures.
6. A study of policy and controls relating to use of land.
 - a. State and regional zoning to include supply and opportunity for low and moderate income housing.
 - b. Environmental impact of land use.
 - c. Structure, funding, and powers of regional, comprehensive planning agencies.
7. Support of improved local, regional, and state-wide services by Illinois state agencies serving children and their families.

8. The study of correctional procedures in Illinois.
 - a. Administration of Bail Bond laws.
 - b. Probation and Parole service.
 - c. Appropriate facilities for detention.
 - d. Diagnostic and rehabilitation programs in institutions.

NATIONAL PROGRAM 1972-1974

1. Environmental Quality:

Support of a physical environment beneficial to life; action to promote wise use of water resources and improvement of water and air quality. Evaluation of solid waste management, including reuse, reclamation and recycling.

2. Land Use:

Evaluation of land-use policies and procedures and their relationship to human needs, population trends, and ecological and socioeconomic factors.

3. Human Resources:

Support of equal rights for all regardless of race or sex, with recognition of the special needs of American Indians: action to combat poverty and discrimination and to provide equal access to employment, housing and quality education.

4. International Relations:

Support of policies to promote international cooperation and world-peace: action to promote international trade and development efforts, to further normalization of relations with the People's Republic of China and to strengthen the peacekeeping and peacebuilding functions of the United Nations system. Evaluation of current trade patterns and their impact on the U.S. and world economy.

5. Representative Government:

Support of an open governmental system that is representative and responsive:

- a. U.S. Congress — study of and action for responsive legislative processes.
- b. Election of the President — action for election of the president and vice-president of the U.S. by direct national popular vote.
- c. District of Columbia — action for self-government and representation in Congress for citizens of the District of Columbia.
- d. Apportionment — action for apportionment substantially on population of congressional districts and of all elected state and local governmental bodies.
- e. Voting Rights — (Bylaws, Article XIII, Section 1, a) Action to protect the right to vote of every citizen.
