PRINCIPLES OF THE LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS

- The League of Women Voters believes in representative government and in the individual liberties established in the Constitution of the United States.
- The League of Women Voters believes that democratic government depends upon the informed and active participation of its citizens and requires that governmental bodies protect the citizen's right to know by giving adequate notice of proposed actions, holding open meetings and making public records accessible.
- The League of Women Voters believes that every citizen should be protected in the right to vote; that every person should have access to free public education which provides equal opportunity for all; and that no person or group should suffer legal, economic or administrative discrimination.
- The League of Women Voters believes that efficient and economical government requires competent personnel, the clear assignment of responsibility, adequate financing and coordination among the different agencies and levels of government.
- The League of Women Voters believes that responsible government should be responsive to the will of the people; that government should maintain an equitable and flexible system of taxation, promote the conservation and development of natural resources in the public interest, share in the solution of economic and social problems which affect the general welfare, promote a sound economy and adopt domestic policies which facilitate the solution of international problems.
- The League of Women Voters believes that cooperation with other nations is essential in the search for solutions to world problems, and that the development of international law is imperative in the promotion of world peace.

HOW THE LEAGUE FUNCTIONS

The League takes ACTION on governmental policies and measures in the public interest in conformity with the principles of the League of Women Voters of the U.S. After thorough study it provides information, influences public opinion and supports or opposes legislation. TIME FOR ACTION occurs when League members are asked to express support or opposition on a position after study and general agreement by all Leagues affected by the proposed legislation. CONSENSUS is the term used to indicate membership agreement on an issue. It is determined by the Board after evaluating membership opinion. A LEAGUE POSITION is that body of opinion expressed in consensus appropriately worded by the League Board.

MEMBERSHIP

All citizens 18 years of age or older are invited to join. Membership in a local League automatically extends to membership in the County, State and National Leagues.

NONPARTISANSHIP POLICY

The League of Women Voters of Lake Forest agree that we, as an organization, must remain nonpartisan; that is, we shall not support nor oppose any political party or candidate.

The Lake Forest LWV Board shall abide by a nonpartisan policy that allows Board Members, except for the President, Voter Service Chairman, and other publicly sensitive positions (by Board definition) to support candidates, and to act as election judges and poll watchers.

Board members may not be officers in a political party organization (i.e. chairman, precinct captain, block captain, etc.)

A Board Member shall resign if she becomes a candidate for elective office in a governmental body or is appointed to fill a vacancy for such office.

A member of the Board may accept appointment to an official board, commission, committee, nominating caucus (except as chairman), or as judge of elections, if such a body is in the judgment of the Board in no way involved in the campaigning for or support of candidates.

The President, Voter Service Chairman and Finance Chairman shall not actively promote an issue that is in conflict with the position of the League of Women Voters.

- C 6. Planning for publication of the "Lake Forest Portrait" in 1983.
- C 1. Study of solid waste disposal in Lake County.
- O 2. Study of the Lake County Board by means of an Observers Corps, including the Board's six standing committees, the Forest Preserve District and the College of Lake County.
- N 3. Publication of an updated "This is Lake County."
- T 4. Continuation of the coordination of the Urban Crisis study on the county level.
- Y 5. Support positions on:
Land use in Lake County
Watershed management in Lake County
- S 1. SCHOOL FINANCE — Support of a public school finance system that achieves greater equity for student and taxpayer without diminishing local control of program and budget.
- S 2. STATE FISCAL POLICIES — Support for state fiscal policies that ensure equity to taxpayers, provide adequate funds to support state and local services and encourage sound land use decisions; and a comprehensive study of financing state and local government that includes revenue sources, expenditure procedures and limitations on taxing and spending.
- T 3. LAND USE — Support of a statewide land use policy for Illinois.
- T 4. ELECTION LAWS — Support of improved election laws and procedures.
- E 5. CHILD WELFARE/JUVENILE JUSTICE — Support of improved services of Illinois state agencies serving children and their families.
- E 6. CONSTITUTIONAL IMPLEMENTATION AND AMENDMENTS — Support for League positions to implement and amend the 1970 Constitution, including a re-study of the Single Member District position and a study of the process of the public initiative, referendum and recall.
- E 7. CRIMINAL JUSTICE — Support of improved criminal justice procedures in Illinois.
