







## Dedication

Musing o'er joys, we knew within these walls.


A little while we'd stop, to think once more Of that momentous day so long ago, When we as freshmen, first approached this door Scarce dreaming of how much we'd some day know.

DORTHA VAN NEST, once so trim and neat, How has grown so heavy, Anti-Fat is all she eats.


Of course you've heard of EVELYN BARE That lawyer of such great fame; She's never lost a case (or husband) yet Don't you wish you could say the same!


### Speech




### The '51 Gridiron Season


#### THESPIANS HOLD DRAMA FESTIVAL
