RAVENSWOOD'S



This year the Ravenswood Red Devils completed their most successful gridiron season in school history. Under the outstanding direction of coaches, Spano and Bokovitz, the Red Devils captured their second state championship in three years and the first Little Kanawha Conference Championship in school history. The Red Devils finished the season with a 10--1 record.

RHS versus WAHAMA--The Red Devils made their first appearance of the season with an impressive 28-18 victory over the Wahama White Falcons. Halfback, Gerry Stephenson tallied 2 touchdowns on 46 and 33-yard runs. End, Ronnie Belue, tallied the other 2 on a pass from Gary Enos and a 30-yard run with an intercepted pass. Jim McKinley dropkicked the 4 extra points.

RHS versus SPENCER--In the second game the fired-up Red Devils stomped a strong Spencer eleven 28-7. Ron Belue scored the first touchdown on a 20-yard pass from Gary Enos. Enos scored the second on a quarterback sneak. The Red Devils scored their other 2 TD's on a 70-yard run after a fumble by Jim Cooper and a short line plunge by Jim Yoakum. Jim McKinley added 4 extra points to the score.

RHS versus MARIETTA--The jittery Red Devils received their lone loss of the campaign against Marietta 48-14. Fullback, Pete Gould, scored the 2 Ravenswood touchdowns and Jim McKinley added the extra points on end runs.

RHS versus SISTERSVILLE--Ravenswood got back on the win trail in their homecoming game beating the Tigers from Sistersville 12-6. Daryl Culp scored both Red Devil touchdowns. The defensive team protected the slim lead in the last quarter, putting up two spirited goal line stands.

RHS versus BUFFALO--For their fifth game of the season, Ravenswood traveled to Buffalo where they downed the Bisons 26-6. Ebby Crow led the scoring with 2 touchdowns, followed by Bob Coates and Jim Cooper with one each Jim McKinley added 2 extra points.

RHS versus CALHOUN--On Oct. 9, Ravenswood pasted Calhoun 38-6. Daryl Culp scored twice on runs of 75 and 34 yards respectively. Wayne Dockery scored on a 10-yard pass from Gary Enos. Pete Gould added the 4th on a 39-yard dash and C. W. Caldwell the 5th on a 5-yard run. Ebby Crow scampered 40 yards with an intercepted pas for the locals last. Jim McKinley added 2.



The victory was a great team effort. After Winfield had scored first, Culp took the kickoff and behind a freak block thrown by Pete Gould outdistanced the entire Winfield team. Culp also added the extra point. In the second quarter, with Winfield in possession of the ball on their own two-yard line, Bill Bryant, Winfield's ace halfback, tried an end run; but Jim Norris made a spectacular play by tackling Bryant in his end zone. This gave Ravenswood 2 points and its final margin of victory. Daryl Culp scored another TD to make the score 15-6, and from then on the Red Devil's defense took over and allowed the Winfield but one more touchdown.
