Abstract

The Linda Killen Collection contains her research of local African American families and their descendants, as well as communities found within the New River Valley region. This research spans from the Antebellum Era to post World War II.

Biographical / Historical Note

Linda Killen was a dedicated historian of both local and international histories Born April 2, 1945, she was well-traveled owing to her father's military background. Passenger lists suggest she left New York in 1953 bound for Le Havre, France, both with her mother, sister, and older brother. Before that she has already been to Japan and to the state of Washington. Her father worked extensively within the governmental system, being at one time a U.S. Department field official and then a director of missions of the agency of International Development where he served in Yugoslavia, Pakistan, Korea, Vietnam, and Turkey. He died in 1972; at the same time Dr. Killen was living in Chapel Hill, N.C., while her siblings were in Beirut, Lebanon and Zurich, Switzerland. (Newspapers.com)

She lived around the world, spending an extended time in Pakistan. She earned her graduate degree from UNC and went on to be employed by Radford University, teaching for twenty-six years. Killen taught Russian history and American Diplomatic History, eventually

publishing works on Yugoslavia and the Soviet Union. Her local endeavors allowed her to research antebellum African American communities. Those who were both enslaved or free before emancipation. Then, following genealogical research of those who stayed within the region decade after the turn of the twentieth century.

Dr. Killen retired in 2001 after teaching for twenty-six years. She died on January 15, 2003 in Pulaski County, Virginia. Today her legacy still continues at Radford University because of two memorial scholarships: one for herself: "Linda Rose Killen Scholarship", and one for her mother: Alice B. Killen Memorial Scholarship".

Those that knew her talked of her independent spirit. She never married but her only surviving relative, her sister, held a memorial service after her death where her cremated remains were ceremoniously scattered into the New River.

Collection Description

This collection includes Killen's personal research and published works, as well as local New River Valley genealogical research, photographs, slave/slave owner records, antebellum free persons records, census records, published articles, her research sources, land records, birth records and maps.

Arrangement Description

The Linda Killen Collection follows the original arrangement established by Dr. Killen. The genealogy records are arranged alphabetically by family surnames. Unframed photographs are in Dr. Killen's original binders.
