# **Biographical / Historical Note**

Leonard Lee was born in Radford, VA in 1935. He attended Fred Wygal Elementary School and Christiansburg Institute, graduating when he was fourteen years old. He enrolled in Virginia State College at 17 years old. He completed a year before enrolling in Navy basic training in Tennessee. He was named honorman for achieving the highest grade point average in his enlisted class.

Lee married Elizabeth Hill on August 22, 1965. They had one son, John Christopher Lee.

Lee served as a jet fighter and a jet combat flying instructor. Flying F4 Phantom fighter jets was one of the most sought-after yet dangerous positions in the Navy. Its combat radius exceeded 900 miles and reached maximum speeds of over Mach 2.

On November 18, 1967, Lee was sent to Vietnam as part of Fighter Squadron VF-114, AKA "Aardvarks." Lee and Radio Intercept Officer Lt. Jr. Grade Roger Innes went on a bomber mission in Nge, North Vietnam on December 27, 1968. The search and rescue mission failed. In 1999, the Vietnamese government returned Lee and Inne's remains and they were buried in Arlington National Cemetery.
