Abstract

The Edgar A. Long Papers contain the writings and administrative records of Christiansburg Institute Principal Edgar A. Long. The papers explore Long's thoughts on religion, education, and race.

Biographical / Historical Note

Edgar A. Long was born in Tuskegee, Alabama, October 8, 1871 to Orange and Lila Hoard Long, both parents formerly enslaved. In 1981, at the age of 20, he entered Tuskegee Institute and graduated in 1895.

Long worked for a newspaper in Birmingham, the Sentinel, as an editor after graduating from Tuskegee. In 1897, he arrived in Christiansburg, Virginia, at the Christiansburg Industrial Institute where he dedicated the next 27 years of his life to the Institute and Southwest Virginia community.

In 1908, Long convened an 'Institute for Colored Teachers of Montgomery County' which ultimately became the 'Southwest Virginia Colored Teachers' Association' where Long served as its first president. Long pioneered the establishment of the 'Christiansburg

Colored Hospital' a remarkable building and state-of-the-art hospital facility located on CI's campus.

Edgar Allen Long is laid to rest on the historic Christiansburg Institute campus in the 'CI Principals Cemetery' next to his wife, Anna Long, herself a lifelong educator at CI that served as interim principal after Edgar's death in 1924.
