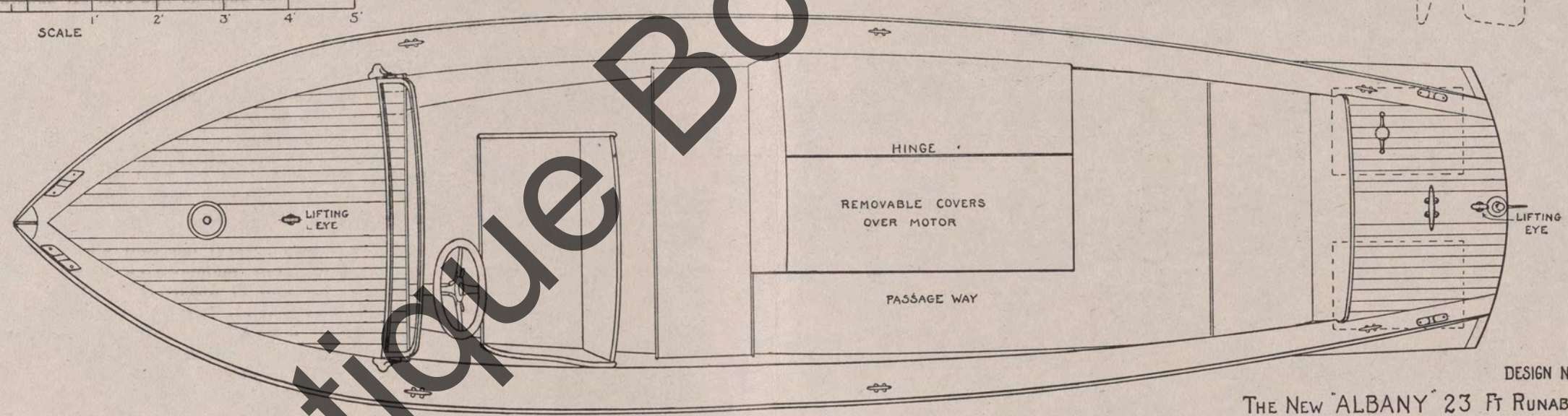
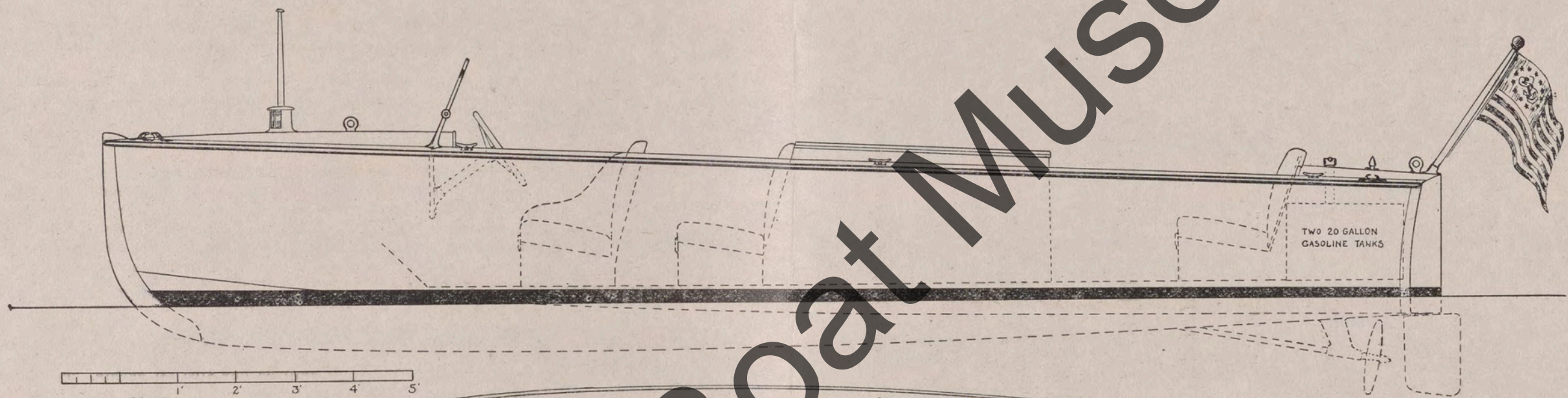

- GENERAL:** Concave V bottom—23 feet x 6 feet x 22 inches draft. Seats 7-8 passengers—100 H. P. honest-to-goodness long lived marine engine—speed 30 miles.
- HULL:** Oak framed—mahogany planked, natural finish—double bottom—brass and copper fastened—mahogany decks and trim.
- COCKPITS:** This boat has a big advantage in the connecting cockpits. Not alone for convenience, but the close fitting enclosure around motor permits maximum space for cockpits: and the passenger weight in forward cockpit being well aft is an obvious advantage in making boat buoyant forward. Note also there are no heavy superstructures, leaving boat with reserve ability to carry gracefully and seaworthily loads as great as much larger boats.
- ACCESSIBLE:** The motor enclosure, or any separate part of it, can be lifted out. In other words, here at last is 100% accessibility.
- STAUNCH:** Some new and we think clever ideas are built into this hull for greater strength and long life. Albany Boats are called quarter century boats and this small runabout enjoys the same skill as our \$100 000 yachts. The things that determine boat safety and lasting qualities are not the glittering finishes that feature Shows, but are the valuable, fundamental things that come only from experience and loving application.
- BEAUTY:** You have seen the Show—have you seen a handsomer boat? The generous free-board makes it look more than a 23 footer and as a fact it will outperform larger boats. The instrument board in rich, distinguished finish and the expensive panel instruments are only finishing touches on a boat built from the keel up of the best materials and the highest standards of boat construction. Even the beautiful Spanish upholstery is properly installed and ventilated to stay sweet. **Beauty is heart deep in this boat.**
- FEATURES:** This model has shown several per cent higher efficiency than any runabout test record we know of. For maneuvering it embodies the latest Albany features, particularly our 1926 and 27 discoveries; all Albany boats now greatly excell in safe and exhilarating hairpin turns and perfect banking on either port or starboard turns. Other new Albany features are lifting rings **bolted through keel**—a pretty and practical ventilating windshield—an easy handling gear steerer with positive neutral position and an emergency tiller—Albany devices for preventing possibility of fire—and other features.
