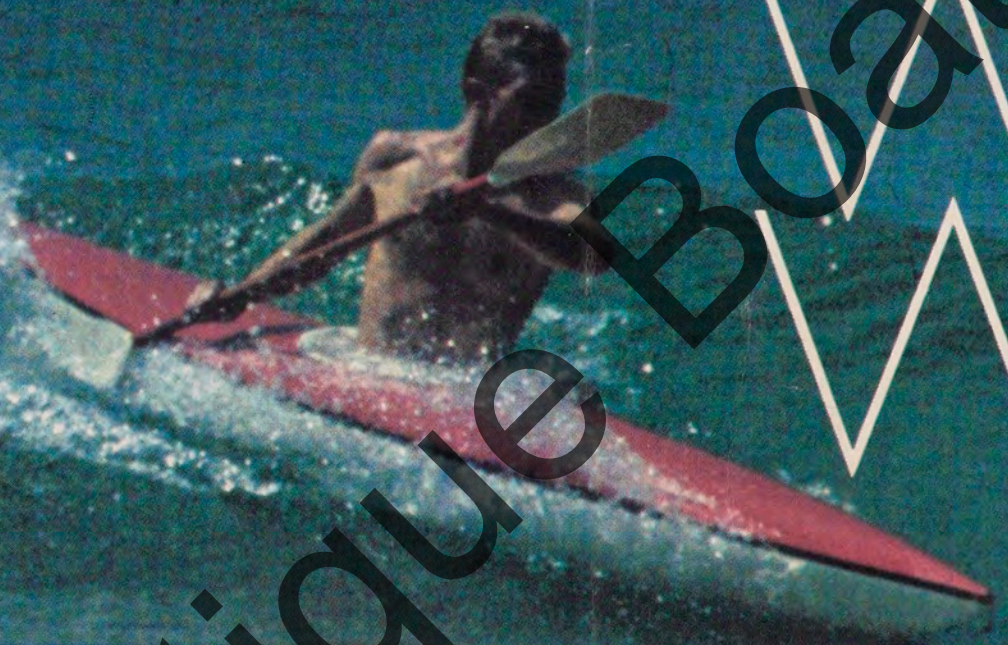

Water in motion. Rumbling around rock after rock. Swirling over ledges and log jams. The pulsating sea. Piling up, up and suddenly curling, crashing down on a stormswept beach. Once only the most daring canoeist could enjoy the thrill of running waters like these. But now with practice anyone can. You can.

Kayak-canoeing is a new, now fun sport. It's grand touring—traveling miles of quick water and quiet, discovering nature on waterways you've never seen before. It's the excitement of white water slalom—twisting, reaching, diving through gates suspended over tumbling water. And wildwater racing—hurtling headlong through a maze of rocks and rumbling currents. It's surfing—locked in the curl of a grinding right, pitchpoling and out for more. It can be tame or violent—any way you like it. But kayak-canoeing is at its best in an Old Town. Designed by one of the country's foremost designers. Selected by the U.S. White Water Team for the 1969 World Championships. New, covered fiberglass Old Town kayaks and canoes are feather light, yet slick and tough. Slither over rocks that would hang up and swamp a traditional canoe. They're very responsive to body movement, but stable in leans on beam ends. Handling white water kayaks or canoes generally requires considerable practice. But no other paddled craft is as maneuverable, as fast, or has as much rapport with the paddler. You'll get a bang out of kayak-canoeing in an Old Town. Wherever you take it.

Construction

Old Town kayaks and white water canoes feature the latest and best hull designs for slalom, downriver and touring. Kayak construction is a laminate of fiberglass cloth and polypropylene for extra strength. Decks are all fiberglass cloth. Molded in bucket seat and bracing, custom installed thigh and adjustable foot braces, make the paddler an integral part of his kayak. Grab loops

installed bow and stern.

White Water canoe hulls feature a sandwich of plastic and end-grain balsa, a rigid core of exceptional strength which eliminates the need for ribs. Decks are laminated fiberglass cloth. Canoes are equipped with built in bucket seats, toe braces, quick release knee straps and knee pads.

Color

Kayaks and canoes can be ordered in any one of 13 different fiberglass colors and combinations for hull and deck. Colors are Celery, Avocado, Dark Green, Jade Green, Turquoise, Blue, Russet (rust orange), Red, Mahogany, Yellow, Sandalwood (dark tan), Desert White and White. White hulls show scratches less than colored hulls. Color caps available on request. Breakout pattern available for decks only—\$40.00 extra. Stock colors are White hull with Red, Yellow, or Blue deck. Allow 3 weeks for other color order.

Accessories

All the latest white water or surfing equipment can be ordered with your kayak. Spray skirt, helmet, life vests, flotation bags, and a spare paddle are recommended for your safety and required in most competition.

Orders

In writing your order, specify model, color, price, and accessory equipment. All prices F.O.B. Old Town, Maine. Pricing of white water craft includes packing for shipment. For added protection, particularly for long distances, a carton is recommended. Cost of carton is \$15.00 additional.

Slalom Kayak

Designed and built for maximum maneuverability demanded in white water slalom competition. Shallow ends and rocker hull will turn on a dime. Fullness amidship provides stability even when leaned on beams ends. Conforms to I.C.F. (International Canoe Federation) measurement rules for white water competition. Equipped with molded seat and leg braces, and five position adjustable foot brace. Used by 1969 U.S. World Team.

Downriver Kayak

Designed for maximum speed demanded in wildwater racing. Swedehull makes this model effortless to paddle. Very fast on an even keel, highly maneuverable in leans and responds to body balance for turns. Conforms to I.C.F. measurements. Equipped with molded seat and leg braces, and five position adjustable foot brace. Used by 1969 U.S. World Team.

Downriver Touring Kayak

A fast, downriver type kayak, with Swedehull. Very stable. Generous cubic volume makes this an excellent craft for both wildwater and extended cruising over open water. Conforms to I.C.F. rules for competition kayaks. Equipped with molded seat, molded leg braces, and five position adjustable foot brace.

Berrigan Canoe

A white water canoe designed for cruising rough waters. Length, 16 feet, is long enough for speed, yet short enough to be very maneuverable. A modest amount of rocker facilitates quick turns. Very stable in heavy rapids. Lines offer maximum strength with a minimum resistance to water. Standard with bow and stern cockpits and center cargo hatch. One man can paddle or fish from cargo hatch in calm waters. Equipped with built-in bucket seats, toe braces, knee straps and pads. Conforms to I.C.F. competition requirements for wildwater and slalom and has placed in tough competition in both.

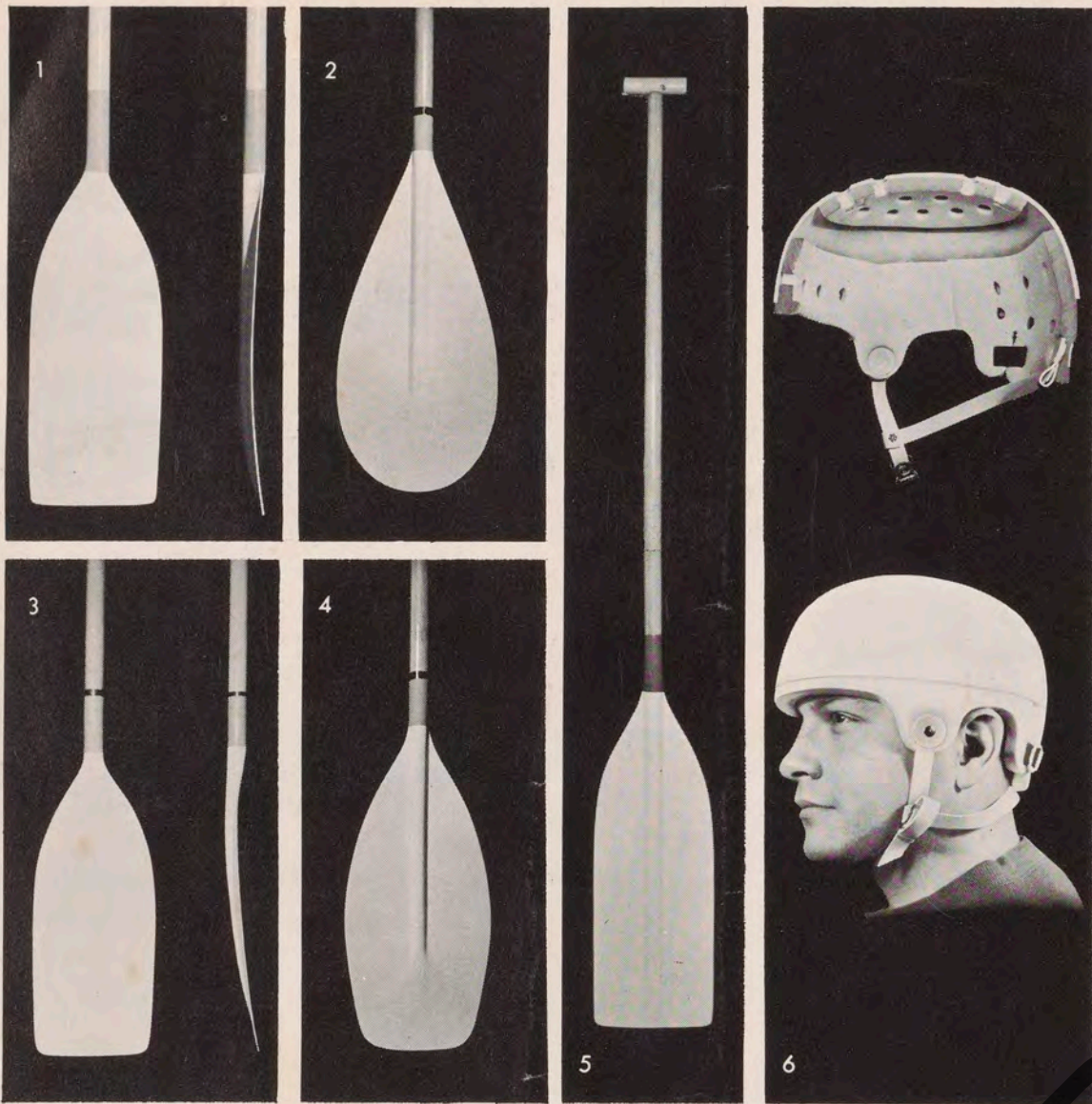
Note: By late spring 1970 Old Town will have C-1 and C-2 Slalom and Wildwater canoes in production. Write for information on these craft at that time.

Accessory Equipment

Paddle construction: Two pressure molded, white fiberglass blades feathered at 90 degrees. One piece, straight-grained spruce shafts, finished with three coats of urethane varnish, hand rubbed and waxed. Paddle selection: Experienced white water paddlers prefer spooned blade. In ordering spoon blade paddles, specify for right-hand grip or left-hand grip. With spoon blade double paddle being held by paddler and the right spoon facing paddler, a left hand grip paddle has left spoon facing down. A right hand grip paddle has left spoon facing up. Novice paddlers find the flat blade more easily controlled.

- 1. Spooned Blade Paddle:** Made in 80, 82, and 84" lengths. Shaft diameter: 1 1/4". Blade area: 7 1/2" x 18". Weight: approximately 3 pounds. Price: \$27.50.
 - 2. Flat Blade Paddle:** Made in 80, 82, and 84" lengths. Shaft diameter: 1 1/4". Blade area: 9" x 20". Weight: approximately 2 1/2 pounds. Price: \$25.00.
 - 3. Junior Spooned Blade Paddle:** Made in 76 and 78" lengths. Shaft: 1 3/16". Blade area: 7" x 17". Weight: approximately 2 1/2 pounds. Price: \$24.50.
 - 4. Junior Flat Paddle:** Made in 76 and 78" lengths. Shaft diameter: 1 3/16". Blade area: 8 1/2" x 19". Weight: approximately 2 1/2 pounds. Price: \$22.50.
 - 5. Canoe Paddle:** Single blade with T Grip. Made in lengths of 60", 62", 64", 66", 68", 70" and 72". Shaft diameter: 1 1/4". Blade area: 7 3/4" x 23". Weight: 2 1/2 pounds. Price: \$20.00.
 - 6. White Water Helmet:** Lightweight, washable. White outer shell of high impact Danlite bonded to shock absorbent vinyl-coated Ensolite liner. Protects whole head and back of neck. Floats. 3 sizes: Small, 6 7/8"-7"; Medium 7 1/8"-7 1/4"; Large, 7 3/8"-7 1/2". Price: \$15.00 ea.
- Cockpit Covers:** For kayaks and canoes. One piece stretch-on Hypalon. Close up craft while cartopping or in storage. Specify model with order. Price: \$12.00 ea.

Flotation Bags

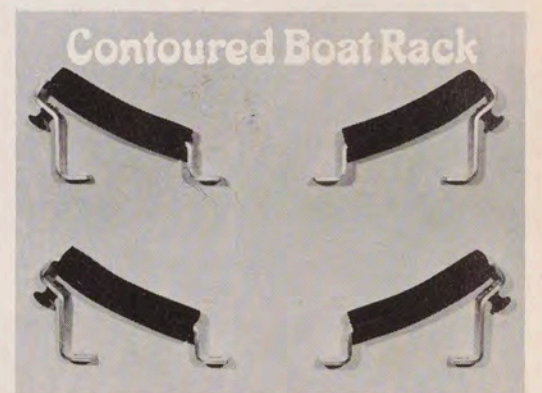
