# The Salvation Army Broomfield Silvercrest Senior Residence

The Broomfield Silvercrest Senior Residence is a joint project of The Salvation Army and the US Government's Department of Housing and Urban Development. The residence will consist of 85 apartments. The comfortable one bedroom apartments will provide safe and affordable housing for many low-income seniors.

Each apartment is approximately 600 square feet in size and consists of a kitchen, living/dining room, bedroom and bathroom. In addition, there are several closets in each apartment. An emergency call system is installed in the bedroom and the bathroom which allows the residents to summon help if they fall or need other medical assistance. The entire building is designed to be accessible to the handicapped with many of the apartments designed to meet the special needs of the hearing impaired or those with other disabilities.

The main floor provides both a dining room for activities and a large, comfortable sitting area for fellowship among the residents. Programs will be provided that will involve the residents in a variety of activities. This will help to provide many opportunities for the residents to lead a happy, fulfilled life in their new homes.

The residence is expected to be completed and ready for occupancy by April 1997. At that time, the Broomfield Silvercrest Residence will become the newest of 40 senior residences operated by The Salvation Army Western Territory in the thirteen western states. We would invite you to join in the joyous Celebration of dedication next year.
