- 1873 Colo Central Rwy fr Denver → Bldg through Bmfd (later UPD & RR) (abandoned now) (now BNRR)
- 1876 Colorado admitted to the Union
- 1877 Church began irrigation system to bring water fr Clear Cr
- 1879 "Neke Massacre" - moved Ind. to reservations
- 1879 Reservoir built - ^{later} narrow gauge stopped here to take on water
- 1880 Lakeview Cemetery, 10th / Main
- 1881 D & P (mq) opened for traffic on November 24
- 5, 6, 7, 1882 Terraine School built - 112th / Pierce
- 1883 Broomfield Hotel, 7435 W. 120th, 1st story of wooden Bldg built
- 1884 First P.O. established 1-26-84. Avenue 1 mile 1st Postoffice
- 1885 Adolph Gang, who had come to CO in 1882, bought -
with 2 partners, dry prairie land from UPRR
- 1885 Daniel H. Hoge bought 160 acres to farm - now Greenway Park
- * 1887 First PD built in July at site of 116 railroad Denver/Espe
- 8 1888 First church established Methodist - sits in Terraine Sch
would abt 1900 - they private home - 112th
- 1889 First business grocer, E. O. Graves
- 1889 P.O. moved to site near new RR (SG), on Matthews property
- 1890 Gang Spur built just W of B. & Grand
- 1890 Lakeview Cemetery
- 1894 P.O. in charge first lock box - charge was 10¢ for 3 months!
- 1895 Gang buys out partners & purchases add'l land -
total 4000 acres

1900 Mary Wright became 1st Brnfd agent for the "Colo Telephone Co" - ^{Feb}

9-10 1901 Sometime prior to 1901 Jones Hall was built, 1st fl housed

1903 Gang started building ^{Gang's Reservoir, now (1911)} B.W. Reservoir - 8 yrs to complete

1906 Jones ^{Hall} Bldg remodeled

1906 P.O. moved to Jones Bldg (?)

1906 Approx. date the second story was added to Broomfield Hotel

1906 Gambling House/Saloon, Pickle, Mill

1907 Cornerstone laid for Warren Chapel

1908 Warren Chapel (Methodist Church) completed

1908 On June 24 D & I started operating Kite Route

1909 19 passenger trains/day (D & I)

11-13 1909 New R.R. depot (now the Museum) ^{donated by BNRR to Brnfd} built by C & S Rwy ^{do with them}

1912 1909 Nov 22 First robbery! Thieves blew open P.O. safe & escaped w/ \$680.00

33-34 1915 Gang gave 1 acre for grange building

1916 Aug 17 - first meeting in new Grange Bldg

1916 John Dungan's flour mill was converted by J. K. Mullen about 9 2

1900 One of oldest residences in Bmfld - the Sauer home - was built

1912 First electricity to Broomfield.

1916 Sept 28 Adolph Gang died

1955 Ground-breaking ceremonies - Bmfd Rts

1958 Sept 22, 6:47 AM, 2 C & S Burlington trains collided ^{4 killed} 35 injured

1958 Safeway opens in Bmfd Drug Bldg (Drug was where Jungues is)

1959 December - volunteers start library

1961 Broomfield incorporated

1962 Library Bldg - donation from Bal Swan

1967 May 30, 9:30 PM Train #29 fr Denver → Billings MT was last passenger train through Bmfd

1972 Jones Hall burned down
