## Rosann's Life

"Rosann Marie Doran, 70, of Broomfield, passed away peacefully at her home on Tuesday, November 6, 2018. She was surrounded by dear friends and loved ones. She is survived by her son and his fiancé, Daniel & Zoe, her sister and brother-in-law, Danette & Bob Grauberger, nephew,

Josh Grauberger, and great-niece Lexi Marie, as well as numerous and beloved family members throughout Denver.

Rosann was the daughter of Daniel (Wally) Schaffer and Josephine Schaffer (neé Brancucci). She grew up in Arvada with her sister Danette, where she attended Arvada High School. Later, she graduated from the University of Northern Colorado, receiving her BA in (English) in 1969. In the mid-1970s, she moved to Broomfield, where 'family' expanded to include her tenacious and loving friendships.

A consummate lover of language, Rosann turned her degree in English into a longtime writing career. She cofounded the Broomfield Enterprise newspaper (1975). After the sale of the newspaper, Rosann transitioned to become Broomfield's public information officer, a post she held for more than 20 years.

In 2013, Rosann was touched and honored receive the "Heart and Soul of Broomfield" award by the Broomfield Community Foundation, in recognition of her years of service.

In retirement, Rosann maintained her passion for our community. She continued to volunteer, and served on a number of committees and boards, including the Broomfield Senior Resource Center, the Broomfield Depot Museum, the Broomfield Chamber of Commerce, the Broomfield Community Foundation, the Emergency Family Assistance Association board, and as secretary for Colorado Press Women.

Rosann never lost sight of her family roots in Arvada and Denver. She was a devoted and loving single mother, and with her unflagging support, her son became a physician. She loved spending time with her huge family, helping cook for enormous Italian family gatherings. She also personally cared for her aging parents and aunts.

Finally, Rosann was an active member of this Nativity of our Lord Catholic Church for more than 40 years. Her lifelong work for others was simply the expression of her faith and values."
