

- 1. Old Broomfield
- 2. Site of "Old" Methodist Church now Jonas Taxidenmy
- 3. Site of Mandelay town and the Church Ranch Stage Stop from the Late 1800's
- 4. Site of Libby Pickle Factory in 1930's
- 5. Former Zang farmland in 1895 it consisted of 4000 acres
- 6. Lornaine School site the first Broomfield school
- 7. Dunphy farm site in the early 1900's. Straight to the east are the Brunner farms
- 8, Kozisek farm site bought by them about 1915. Behind the house stood a huge hip-roofed barn
- 9. Lakeview Cemetany Incorporated in 1890 oldest trave 1889.

  Now owned by the city
- 10. Site of one of Zang's many lakes on his farmland and the reason for the jog in 10th Ave. Another Zang lake site is where Safeway is
- 11. Zang country home 680 Poppy Way. There were two huge horse barns at approximately 6th Ave and Poppy Way that housed his prized Percheron horses
- 12. Site of the Broomfield School used in early 1900's
- 13. Home place of the Cnawford family father Hanny and son Miles were both postmasters here covering times during late 1800's and 1945-1965
- 14. Sites of the two grain elevators since 1916 and 1920
- 15. Original site of the Broomfield Depot, now a museum at new location2201 W. 10th Ave.. Originally built in 1909
- 16. Grave of "Shep" a dog that was the friend of the men who ran the toll
  - booth on the tunnpike to Boulden when it was still a toll road
- 17. Telephone Exchange Building first one built for that purpose
- 18. First site of Broomfield on DU & P narrow gauge railroad
- 19. Lower Church Lake
- 20. Upper Church Lake
