Dear Mr. Dennys:

Thank you for your letter of the 22nd instant together with the draft Memorial petitioning the Earl Marshal for a Grant of Arms.

The dates, etc. have been pencilled in on the draft and the following suggestions are submitted for your consideration:

(a) In paragraph 2, after 'entitled The Devonshire College Act 1870', it should read something like this: 'did empower the Governor and Council to appoint Body Number One of the Devonshire College Trustees to provide and control a school in Pembroke Parish. The Trustees subsequently purchased the premises in Pembroke Parish now occupied by the Saltus Grammar School'. (see Sections 4 and 10 of 1879 Act).

(b) Paragraph 4 should be deleted as the Board of Governors established by the Saltus Grammar School Act 1903 apparently never functioned. (See page 4 of commentary by Sir John W. Cox.)

(c) Paragraph 5 should begin 'That the Body Number One of the Devonshire College Trustees.....'

I trust that the above will be of some assistance to you.
