I enclose for your consideration a draft Memorial petitioning the Earl Marshal for a Grant of Arms. To put on record something of the early history of the School I have alluded briefly to the old Devonshire College, but you may feel that this is not really relevant and that some of this can be omitted. We want to keep it short and to the point.

It is important to get it right, because the wording of the Earl Marshal's Warrant follows that of the Memorial, and the wording of the Letters Patent follows that of the Warrant.
