Dear Mr. Dennys:

Your letter of 20th ultimo advising that action on the Letters Patent granting Armorial Bearings to the above School is now proceeding was received last week.

I forwarded the draft of the Letters Patent to my nephew, Mr. R. H. Motyer, of the firm of Appleby, Spurling & Kempe, Barristers and Attorneys, and I am enclosing a copy of his reply. You will see that he confirms my opinion that no mention should be made of the Governors of Saltus Grammar School incorporated under The Saltus Grammar School Act 1903, as this Body is no longer in existence and definitely does not govern the School. The governing body of the School is Body Number One of the Devonshire College Trustees and the Letters Patent should grant the Armorial Bearing to the School in the name of this Body.

I am returning your draft with this letter and should there be any further queries, I shall be in London March 29th to April 3rd and shall be glad to call at the College of Arms.
