DRAFT

That pursuant to an Act of the Governor, Council and Assembly of the Crown Colony of the Bermudas or Somers Islands, dated the twenty first day of September 1816, a school or college was founded in Devonshire parish in the said Colony, being known by the name of Devonshire College.

That under The Devonshire College Act, 1870, of the said Legislature, the Governor and Council were empowered to appoint certain Trustees, by the name of the Body Number One of the Devonshire College Trustees, to take over the assets of the said College and administer them until such time as a school could be reestablished, and the said Trustees subsequently purchased the premises in Pembroke parish now occupied by Saltus Grammar School.

That the late Samuel Saltus of Pembroke Parish aforesaid, gentleman, did in and by his Will dated the twenty ninth day of July 1879, and proved the thirtieth January following, devise and bequeath the residue of his real and personal estate to Trustees upon Trust to apply the income for the purpose of establishing a school in the said Colony, the said Trustees being incorporated under the Saltus Trust Act, 1938, of the said Legislature. That under The Saltus Grammar School Act 1903, of the said Legislature, the Governors of the Saltus Grammar School were incorporated with perpetual succession and a common seal.

That Body Number One of the Devonshire College Trustees is desirous that the Governors of the said SALTUS GRAMMAR SCHOOL shall have fit and proper Armorial Ensigns as well for use on their Common Seal as by the body of the said School.
