Dear Mr. Denny:

Thank you for your letter of 6th August together with the enclosed sketch of a design for the arms and crest for the above School.

Your proposals have been given careful consideration and the design in general has been approved by the Trustees of the School and your sketch therefore signed by the Chairman, Mr. Thomas W. P. Vesey.

It is agreed that, as the School colours are red and blue, your suggestions of red martlets and red and blue mantling would be most appropriate. The shape of the silver salt on your sketch also met with approval and it is suggested that the School motto 'Labor omnia vincit' could be in silver or gold. Enclosed is a sketch which was used to give my Trustees some indication of the probable final design. Unless some drastic changes are necessary it would be appreciated if you would proceed with this design for the School at your earliest convenience.
